OUNT Richecourt, Prefident of the Council of this Regency, is returned here from his late Tour to Pifa; and on Monday, being the Feaft, of S<sup>ta</sup>. Therefia, her Imperial Majefty's Name-day, his Excellency gave a grand Entertainment, and afterwards a Ball, to a great Number of Perfons of Diftinction of both Sexes. 'Tis faid another Reform in our Troops will foon take Place, and that all the Military Force, allowed for the Protection and Defence of this Grand Dutchy, will then confift only of three Regiments of Foot, and one of Dragoons.

Strasbourg, Oct. -26. Baron Wensen, heretofore Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Denmark to the Court of Spain, and who, on his Return from Copenhagen to Madrid, was obliged to flop at Lyons, on Account of an Indifposition with which he was fuddenly feized, arrived here laft Week, greatly recovered; he has fince continued his Journey for Copenhagen, by the Way of Cassel. The Marquess de Argenfon, the new Lieutenant General of this Province, who has been here for about three Weeks, is also set out on his Return to Paris. A most magnificent Monument is erecting, in the Lutheran Church of St. Thomas, in order to perpetuate the Memory of the late Marshal Count Saxe. The Swifs Regiment of Lochmann, confifting of three Battalions, passed through this City on Thursday last, on their March for Landau, where they are to reft in Garrifon. We learn from Emichfbourg, in the Lower Palatinate, that the Counters de Linnage-Dachsberg was safely delivered of a Daughter, who had been chriftened by the Name of Elizabeth-Christine-Marienne. Caffel, Oct. 29. The Hereditary Prince of Anspach, who has been for some Time past at

the Courts of Berlin and Brunfwick, arrived here on Wednefday Night laft.

Dusseldorp, Nov. 6. A Resolution having been taken at Court, to change the Situations of the several Regiments garrisoned in this Dutchy and that of Juliers, Orders are given for providing the necessary Provisions and Carriages for that Purpose.

#### Whitehall, November 17.

The King has been pleafed to conflitute and appoint Humphry Bland, Esq; Lieutenant-General of his Majefty's Forces, to be Commander of all and fingular the Land Forces employed, or to be employed, in his Majefty's Service, in that Part of the Kingdom of Great Britain called Scotland, and also of the Caffles, Forts, and Barracks there, in the room of George Churchill, Esq; deceased.

#### Dublin, November 11.

Yefterday being the Anniverfary of his Majefty's Birth Day, the Great Guns were fired in his Majefty's Park the Phœnix, and anfwered by Vollies from the Regiments in Garrifon, which were drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks; in the Evening a Play was given by his Grace the Lord Lieutenant for the Entertainment of the Ladies; and the Night concluded with Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy. The Birth Day happening on Saturday, the Ball at the Caffle, and the Supper, are defert'd until Monday.
