AST Week a Courier arrived here from Madrid, whole Difpatches have occasioned the holding of several Coun-

cils. The Differences between this Court and the Maltefe are now carried fo far, that the Subjects of these Kingdoms are forbid, by the King's express Order, to fend any Provifions or Merchandize whatfoever to that Island. Leghorn, Nov. 15. We learn by the Mafter of one of our Ships lately arrived in this Port from the Coaft of Barbary, that the contagious Diftemper, which raged fome Time ago at Algiers, is now entirely ceased; and that towards the End of last Month, an Algerine Corfair had brought in a French Ship which the took in the Streights of Gibraltar, under Pretence of her not being provided with a proper Pafs. Parma, Nov. 17. On the 2d Inffant the Infanta Dutchess left Genoa, and reached Voltagio that Night, the next Day fhe reached Novi, and arrived on the 4th at Voghera, where the Marquess d'Ormea attended to compliment her on the Part of the King of Sardinia, through whofe Territories the was efforted by a Detachment of Piemontese Horse. On the 5th in the Morning that Princess set out from Voghera, and got that Night to Castel-San-Joanno, where the Infant Duke her Spoule waited her Arrival. On the 6th their Royal Highneffes reached Plasentia, where they rested the 7th, and arrived here on the 8th. That Day the Infanta received the Compliments of the Nobility, Gentry, and Citizens in a Body; upon her Arrival; and the Night concluded with Illuminations and other publick Rejoycings, which were afterwards continued for three Days fueceffively. Milan, Nov. 18. Count Linden d'Aspremont, who is appointed to command the Imperial Troops in Austrian Lombardy, under the Duke of Modena, arrived here Yesterday in the Afternoon: He was faluted with 24 Pieces of Cannon at his Entrance into this City, and was foon after complimented, upon his Arrival, by the Nobility and principal Officers of the Garrifon. Stockholm, Nov. 20. The Squadron that has been cruizing for fome Time past in the Baltick, is returned to Carlfcroon; and as the Court has received certain Advice of the Ruffian | Prince his Son, during his Minority:

Squadron's being laid up for the Winter, outs is alfo ordered to be unrigged.

Genoa, Nov. 22. The Marquess Grimaldi, heretofore Minister Plenipotentiary from Spain to the Court of Sweden, and fince named his Catholick Majesty's Ambassador to the States General of the United Provinces, is arrived here to fettle his private Affairs, after which he is to fet out for the Hague. The French Gallies, which escorted the Infanta Dutchess of Parma, are put to Sea for Antibes. On Friday last the Chevalier de Guevara, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of the Two Sicilies to the Court of Portugal, arrived in this City. He proposes to ftay here five or fix Days, and then proceed on his Journey to Lisbon. We hear from Cadiz, that an Advice-Boat, dispatched from the Governor of the Havanna, was arrived in that Bay, the Master whereof reports, that towards the Beginning of last Month, there had been a fmart Engagement between the Spanish Guarda Coftas, and four Dutch Ships, off the Coaft of the Caraccas, in which two of the Dutch Ships, were funk, the other two escaping with great Difficulty. Vienna, Nov. 24. We are informed the Court intends to remove next Thursday from Schonbrun, to refide here for the Winter. Her Imperial Majesty has appointed the Count d'Oftein, Brother to the Elector of Mayence, to be Field Marshal of her Armies. 'Tis said the Marriage of the eldeft Son of the Great Chamberlain Count Khevenhuller, with the eldest Daughter of Prince Lichtenstein, will be celebrated in the Month of January next. Dresden, Nov. 27. The Small Pox is very rife here at prefent. Prince Clement and the young Count Loos are both feized with it. And Marshal Lowendahl's eldest Daughter is lately dead of that Diftemper. Hague, Dec. 6. M. Gefler having been appointed Counfellor of the Admiralty of Frizeland, has taken, in that Quality, the usual Oaths to the Affembly of their High Mightineffes. The Baron de Burmania, Deputy to the Council of State, on the Part of the Province of Frizeland, is arrived here from that Province. We are informed by our last Letters from Germany, that the late Prince of Naffau-Weilbourg has named, by his Will, the Princes of Naffau-Ufingen and Naffau-Saarbruck, to be Tutors to the
