Lisbon, December 6.

ON Saturday last their Majesties came from Belem to their Palace in this City for the Winter. The Queen Dowager is perfectly recovered from her late Indisposition, and has received the Compliments of the Nobility and Foreign Ministers on that Occasion. The three Ships that have been for some Time equipping in this Port, put to Sea on Monday last for Angola and Marignan. We are informed by our last Dispatches from America, that the Commissaries appointed to regulate the Limits between this Court and that of Spain, meet with great Difficulties in their Proceedings, the Jesuits settled at Nuova Colonia, having spirited up the Indians to prevent the Island of St. Sacrament being put into the Hands of Spain according to Treaty; and those Indians have declared, that it never shall be delivered to or possessed by the Spaniards.

Moscow, Dec. 8. Her Imperial Majesty being perfectly recovered of her late Indisposition, set out on Monday last for the Monastery of Troitzka, where her Birth-day was celebrated on Thursday with great Magnificence. The Weather here continues quite mild and pleasant. By our last Advices from Constantinople, the Grand Seignor has renewed his Assurances of living in Friendship with the Christian Powers. They write from Persia, that the Affairs of that Kingdom are still in a very unhappy Situation.

Barcelona, Dec. 20. The three Men of War that have been for some Months on a Cruize against the Corsairs of Barbary, are returned into Port, where they are ordered to be unrigged and laid up. The Regiment of Foot of Zamora, which has been in Garrison for some Years at Oran, arrived here a few Days ago. The late Tempests have done great Damage all along our Coasts, several Ships and Vessels having been cast away, amongst which is a French Ship of 24 Guns. Don Joseph de Looz, whom the King has appointed Governor of the Castle of Rozalcazar near Oran, arrived

here a few Days ago from Madrid; he is going to take Possession of that Fortress, of which he is greatly to augment the Fortifications next Summer.

Stockholm, Dec. 24. The Court went this Morning for Ulricksdahl, where their Majesties propose to stay four or five Days. Prince Frederick Adolphus, their Majesties third Son, is a little indisposed, but we hope his Illness will be attended with no fatal Consequences. M. de Rhodt, who resided here for several Years in Quality of Minister from the King of Prussia, set out last Week on his Return to Berlin.

Vienna, Dec. 29. The Count de Berlaas, whom her Imperial Majesty has appointed President of the Chamber of Finances of the Bannat of Temeswar, is preparing to set out, in order to take Possession of that important Charge. They continue to say, that five Imperial Regiments of Foot, now quartered in Hungary, will be ordered to march in the Spring into Lombardy.

Turin, Dec. 29. The Duke of Modena is expected at Milan in about ten Days, Orders being already given for a great Number of Post Horses to be held in Readiness on the Road. The Marquis de St. Marsan return'd hither last Sunday from his Embassy to Madrid. Yesterday the young Prince of Anhalt Bernburg left this Place, and proposes passing the Winter in France, and being in England next Summer.

Brussels, Jan. 6. They write from Louvain, that the principal Sluice of the new Canal had been forced away by the prodigious Swelling of the Waters after the late heavy Rains.

Venlo, Jan. 7. A large Gang of Robbers having lately committed great Outrages in this Neighbourhood, a Detachment of Troops from our Garrison were a few Days ago ordered to go in Quest of them; and they have already secured five or six, who are all committed to Prison.
