Lisbon, Dec. 18. The Time for the Departure of the different Fleets for America is regulated as follows, viz. that for Rio de Janeiro is, for the future, to put to Sea the Beginning of January; that for the Bay of All Saints in the Month of February; that for Fernambuco in March; and that for Maranham in April. The Court having been informed, that an Algerine Corsair was seen at the Mouth of the Tagus, a Man of War, commanded by Captain da Costa-Britto, was ordered immediately to sail in quest of her.

Moscow, Dec. 27. They have finished the rebuilding that Part of the Imperial Palace which was lately burnt down, and are furnishing it with all possible Diligence; but 'tis doubted whether the Empress's Birth-Day, which falls on Saturday next, will be celebrated there or not. 'Tis said a Present of three hundred thousand Rubles is intended to be made to her Imperial Majesty, by the Senate, the first Day of her coming to reside at that Palace. In the Night between Monday and Tuesday last, a Fire broke out near the River Mosca, which burnt down several Houses and Warehouses, and damaged a great Quantity of Goods. The Great Princess is indisposed, and confined to her Chamber.
