**W**HEREAS His Majesty hath signified unto us His Royal Pleasure, that the Parliament of this Kingdom be Prorogued, we do therefore Publish and Declare, that the said Parliament be, and accordingly the said Parliament is hereby Prorogued unto Tuesday the Second Day of April next; whereof the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Commons in this present Parliament assembled, are to take Notice accordingly.

G O D Save the K I N G.

*Moscow, January 3.* The Empress, on her Birth-Day, created the two Counts Schwallow, Knights of the Order of St. Andrew; and several new Knights of the Orders of St. Alexander and St. Anne, were also created the same Day. Her Imperial Majesty has presented the Vice-Chancellor Count Woronzoff with a considerable Estate in Livonia. Baron Pretlak, late Ambassador from their Imperial Majesties to this Court, is at Length set out for Vienna, having at his Departure received the usual Present of 16000 Rubles.

*Naples, Jan. 8.* They write from Leghorn, that several Corsairs are lately put to Sea from the Ports of Tunis and Algiers, in order to cruize on the Ships of those Christian Powers with whom they are not in Treaty; and the said Corsairs having been since seen in the Canal of Piombino, the Court has ordered two Men of War and a Frigate to be immediately equipped, in order to give Chace to those Pyrates.

They are very diligent and successful in raising Men for completing the six new Battalions with which the King resolved some Time since to augment the Troops of this Kingdom.

*Vienna, Jan. 19.* Field Marshal Count Neuperger is arrived here from his Government of Luxembourg, and Yesterday he was admitted to a private Audience of her Imperial Majesty. The Departure of Baron Swackheim for Constantinople, being fixed for the 28th of this Month, all the Presents which he is to carry with him from their Imperial Majesties to the Grand Seignior, are getting ready as fast as possible. The Empress has caused an Ordonnance to be published, prohibiting, for the future, the bringing of any foreign Soap into any Part of her Hereditary Dominions.

*Copenhagen, Jan. 19.* The King has declared his Intention of going in the Spring to Holstein, and the Colonels Haugh and Gehler have already received Orders to repair thither, in order to make the necessary Preparations for forming a Camp in that Province in the Month of May next. The Princess Louisa, a Ship belonging to our East-India Company, put to Sea Yesterday Morning on her Voyage to China. Last Monday Baron d'Ahlefeld, lately appointed Minister Plenipotentiary from this Court to that of Prussia, set out from hence for Berlin.

*Berlin, Jan. 25.* Yesterday being his Majesty's Birth-Day, who then entered into the 42d Year of his Age, the same was celebrated at Court as usual; on which Occasion the Prince de Loos, Great Chamberlain, gave a grand Supper, and afterwards a Ball, to most of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction of both Sexes. The King has appointed M. Labes to reside at the Court of Vienna, in Quality of Secretary of the Legation, in the Room of M. Holzendorf, who has obtained Leave to resign that Employment. On Saturday last Prince Louis of Wirtemberg took Leave of his Majesty, the two Queens, and the rest of the Royal Family, and on Sunday Morning his Serene Highness set out for the Court of the Duke his Brother

Brother at Stuttgard. M. de Marwitz, lately appointed President of the Chamber of War and Domains at Konigsberg, is arrived here from Breslau; as soon as he has received his Instructions, he is to set out for Konigsberg, in order to take Possession of that Employment.

Hague, Jan. 31. This Morning her Royal Highness the Princess Governante took the Diversion of Sledging upon the Snow with her Children, as far as the Village of Schevening: Her Royal Highness was accompanied in this Party of Pleasure by Baron Grovensteins, Master of the Horse, and several other Persons of Distinction.
