

Alarm it occasions, both in the Port and all along the Coast, amongst the Officers of such Ships as belong to Christian Powers with whom the Tunicians are not in Treaty.

*Turin, Jan. 19.* His Excellency Count Cristiani arrived at Milan the 10th of this Month. He was saluted at his Arrival with 24 Guns, and the Tribunals of Justice, and the Nobility, went to his House to acknowledge him as their Chief. His most Serene Highness the Duke of Modena, who also arrived there the 14th, was saluted with 36 Guns. He was met upon the Stairs of the Palace by the Tribunals above-mentioned, and all the Body of Nobility; at the Head of whom was the Great Chancellor Count Cristiani. They afterwards went into the Duke's Apartment, and acknowledged him as Administrator of the Government. His Serene Highness has since received the Compliments of the Commander in Chief of the Troops, attended by all the Officers; and also those of all the chief Magistrates of the Town. His Excellency the Marquis d'Aix, Knight of the Order of the Annunciation, and Governor of this Town, died at Chambery on the 16th Instant.

*Madrid, Jan. 21.* Yesterday being the King of Naples's Birth-day, their Catholick Majesties received the Compliments of the Nobility and Foreign Ministers upon that Occasion. The Chevalier de Guevara, lately appointed Minister Plenipotentiary from his Sicilian Majesty to the Court of Portugal, arrived here the Beginning of last Week, and had the Honour of being presented to their Majesties; he has since been to wait upon the Queen Dowager at St. Ildefonso, and intends continuing his Journey to Lisbon in a few Days. By Letters from Cadiz of the 15th Instant, we have an Account of the Arrival of a Register Ship from Cartagena, said to be very rich.

*Dantzick, Jan. 25.* Baron Pretlak, heretofore Ambassador from their Imperial Majesties at the Court of Russia, arrived here last Wednesday Evening from Moscow. Yesterday Morning he was complimented by a Deputation from the Magistracy of this City, and in the Afternoon he continued his Journey for Vienna.

*Vienna, Jan. 26.* The Chevalier Correro, Ambassador from the Republick of Venice to this Court, will make his publick Entry into this City the Beginning of the Month of May next, and he has already begun to make Preparations for that Purpose. Her Imperial Majesty has appointed Lieutenant Colonel Felix to be Colonel of the Regiment of Foot of Arnim, vacant by the Death of the late Count Arnim.

*Turin, Jan. 26.* The Marquis de Clerici arrived here from Milan the Beginning of this Week, to compliment the King of Sardinia on the Part of the Duke of Modena, and to notify his most Serene Highness's having taken upon him the Administration of the Government of Milan; and To-morrow he will leave this Place on his Return to Milan.

*Dresden, Jan. 27.* The Hereditary Prince of Modena set out from hence Yesterday Morning on his Return to Vienna, extremely satisfied with the Reception he met with at this Court. A few Hours after his Departure the Electoral Princess was brought to Bed of a Prince, whose Birth was soon after made known to the People by a triple Discharge of the Cannon upon our Ramparts. The new-born Prince was christened the same Night by the Names of Joseph-Marie-Louis, &c. the Dauphin and Dauphiness of France standing Godfather and Godmother, by their Proxies Prince Charles and the Princess Christine; and to Day Te Deum was sung in all the Churches of this City, on Occasion of her Royal Highness's happy Delivery. They write from Leipzick, that a Body of twenty Robbers were secured last Week in that City, being Part of a large Gang, who have for some Time past infested this Electorate, and committed the greatest Disorders.

*Frankfort, Jan. 28.* The Austrian Officers continue to raise Recruits in this City and its Neighbourhood with great Success, several Parties having lately marched from hence in order to join their respective Regiments. Baron Reischack, Envoy Extraordinary from their Imperial Majesties to the States General of the United Provinces, passed through this City a few Days ago in his Way from the Hague to Vienna. We are informed by several private Letters from the Weteraw, that the Countess de Isembourg, Daughter to the late Count of that Name, died at Budinga on the 18th Instant, in a very advanced Age.

*Hague, Feb. 5.* The States of Holland and Westfrizeland will open their Assembly To-morrow, for which Purpose most of the members are already arrived. Yesterday M. Cautebach, the Polish Resident, notified in Form to her Royal Highness the Princess Governante, and to their High Mightinesses the States-General, the Birth of a Prince, of whom the Electoral Princess of Saxony was safely delivered on the 26th of last Month. Prince William of Hesse Philipstall is appointed Major to the Regiment of Horse of Heynenoors, and M. Holthe is appointed Major to that of Dragoons of Nassau. On Friday last the Princess Governante, the Prince Stadtholder, and the young Princess, accompanied by several Persons of Distinction, took again the Diversion of Sledging upon the Voorhout, and through several of the principal Streets of this Place. They write from Lillo, that M. Prevost, Major of that Fort, died there a few Days ago.
