THE raising of Recruits for the Swedish Regiments quartered in Stralsund, and other Places of Pomerania, goes on very successfully. We are assured, that Orders are sent to Holsteln and Sleswick, to make the proper Dispositions for the Reception of the Troops who are to be encamped in the Spring in those Dutchies. They write from Copenhagen, that Admiral Rosenpalm, Knight of the Order of Dannebrog, &c. died there on the 18th Instant, in a very advanced Age.

Berlin, Jan. 29. On Saturday last the King, accompanied by the Margrave Henry, Prince Ferdinand, Prince Frederick of Brunswick, and several General Officers and Persons of Distinction, were present at the trying of several Pieces of Cannon and Mortars of a new Invention; after which the Regiment of Artillery went through their Exercise and passed in Review before his Majesty, who was greatly satisfied with their Appearance and Behaviour.

Brussels, Jan. 30. Count Lanoy, Governor of this City, is returned here from Tournay, having obtained the Consent of the Inhabitants of that City to pay a new Subsidy, demanded by her Imperial Majesty, for ten Years; which Subsidy the States of the Province of Hainault have consented to pay only for five Years.
