HE raising of Recruits for the Swedish Regiments quartered in Stralsund, and other Places of Pomerania, goes on very successfully. We are assured, that Orders are sent to Holsteln and Sleswick, to make the proper Dispositions for the Reception of the Troops who are to be encamped in the Spring in those Dutchies. They write from Copenhagen, that Admiral Rosenpalm, Knight of the Order of Dannebrog, &c. died there on the 18th Instant, in a very advanced Age.
