Whereas the Post Boy, bringing the Kent Mail to  
this Office, upon Thursday the 28th of February last,  
was, between the Hours of Eight and Nine of the  
Clock in the Evening, attacked and robbed, at a Place  
called Snipps Hill, about a Mile beyond Sittingborn by  
three Footpads, one of whom fired a Pistol, seized the  
Horse which carried the Mail, beat the said Post Boy  
cruelly, and cut the Mail from the Horse and carried  
it away.

Two of the Persons who committed this Robbery are  
described as short Men; dressed like Sailors; and the  
other a tall Man in a red Coat.

This is therefore to give Notice, That whoever shall  
apprehend and convict, the Persons, or any of them  
who committed this Robbery, will be intitled to a Re-  
ward of Two Hundred Pounds, over and above the  
Reward given by Act of Parliament for apprehending  
of Highwaymen: Or if any Person or Persons, whe-  
ther Accomplice in the said Robbery, or knowing thereof,  
do, or shall make Discovery, whereby any one, or more  
of the Persons, who committed the same, may be ap-
