Warfam, Offob. 24. Our last Letters from the Fron-tiers advise, that the Troops of Lythuania were come up, and had joyned those of this Kingdom, and that his Majesty had now an Army together of 30000 brave Combatants; that the King had been informed from good hands, that the Grand Signior was retreated towards the Donaw, intending, as was thought, to return to Conftantinople, tu give Orders about the af-Fairs of Afia; and that the Grand Vizier was arrived at Cambrie to look after Matters in hofe parts. Our advices concerning the Moscowites are very uncertain, and vary every Post, so that we can hardly sell in what posture they are, in relation to the War, or what courfe they intend to take; They have indeed a great Army together, under the Command of an old experienced General Rodanowski, and according to the Treaty between the Czar and this Crown, he ought to joyn part of his Army with ours, and profecute the War vigoroully against the Common Enemy, but shose People are by nature so jealous and distrustful, that they give credit to every report that is spread abroad, of a Peace being concluded between the Turks and me, and on that account, keep at a distance, as if they feare us more then the Turks.

Madrid, Octob. 24. The news we have this week from Catalonia does not at all please us, for our Let-ters tell us, That Licutenant-Admiral Van Tromp having landed 1500 Men at Roses, the Duke of St. Germain, for whose reinforcement they were intended, had declared, that so small a number of Men was no way sufficient to enable him to keep the Field, and make head against the Enemy; that thereupon Lieutenane-Admiral Van Tromp had taken his Men on board again, and was failed to the Westward, in order to his return home, he having, as he faid, politive Orders from the States-General, not to winterabroad si That the Duke of St. Germain finding the Forces he had with him to be very few, and besides, in no very good condition, had put them into winter Quarters, and was hiddelfereturned to Barcelons. We had promifed our selves here, that this Squadron of Dicely Memof War, under the Command of Monfigur Tremp, would

have affifted as in the reducing the City of Majorina and his so suddain return towards Holland, seems a great disappointment to this Court, who begin to look upon the troubles at Messia to be of very great consequence, in relation to the peace of the Kingdoms of First and Maples, and have therefore resolved to act in this affair, with all the vigor possible. The Royal Armada sailed some weeks since from Basselons, consisting in an Men of War, towards Messia, and we are in daily expectation to hear of its arrival there; the Galleys of this Kingdom, being 12 in all, are likewise sailed that way. We do not yet hear, of the arrival of our Newspain Fleet, which we expect with great impatience.

Venier, Octob. 26. We have now advice from Legiste of the taking of \$1. Salvader by the Adelsine of the fame into the hands of the french, but we do not yet give an entire credit to it. We hear that twenty Spanish Men of War have appeared off of Trapani, being on their way towards \$5 cits, to be employed against Mefains.

Hambrough, Nov. 6.
