Complaint having been made, that the Duty which used to be paid in the Dominions of the Empress Queen of Hungary, for such Merchandize and Provisions as are manufactured or produced in this Country, and carried thither, Orders are given for laying an additional Duty on all Wines and Provisions brought into his Majesty's Dominions from Austria, or any other of the Empress's Hereditary Countries.

*Brussels, May 31.* 'Tis said the Conferences for regulating the Barrier and Tariff will shortly be renewed. M. de Wildt, Major General in the Armies of the Empress Queen, died here on the 22d of this Month, and was interred last Friday, with all the Honours due to his Rank. And on Thursday died M. Boschaert, Counsellor of the Domains and Finances of her Imperial Majesty. We hear that the Regiment of Foot of Leewe, in the Service of the States General, marched on Saturday last from Tournay for Ypres, from whence the second Battalion of Waldeck marched the same Day for Namure.

*Hague, June 4.* 'Tis said her Royal Highness the Princess Governante intends to set out the Middle of next Week with her Family for Orange-Woud, in order to spend some Time with the Princess Dowager of Orange. The States of Holland and Westfrizeland are to open their Assembly To-morrow, for which Purpose most of the Members are already arrived.
