They write from Madrid, that the Squadron, which has been for some Time fitting out at Barcelona, is failed from that Port for the Place of its Destination.

Hague, June 18. We are informed by an Express from Oranje-Woud, that her Royal Highnels the Princels Governante, accompanied by the young Prince Stadtholder, and the Princess Caroline, arrived there on Saturday last, in perfect Health. The States of Holland and Westfrizeland separated last Friday. M. vanden Clooster has taken the usual Oaths to their High Mightinesses the States General, in Quality of Major General of Foot; as has M. Bruce to the Council of State, to qualify him for the Post of Lieutenant Colonel of the Regiment of Sporke. Her Royal Highness the Princess Governante has been pleased to appoint Baron Ootmarsum, to be High Bailiff of the Quarter of Twente, in the Room of Count Charles Bentinck, who has obtained her Royal Highness's Leave to resign that Employment; and M. Raesfeld is appointed High Bailiff of Haxbergen and Diepenbeim. M. Berkenrode, Ambassador from this Republick to the Court of France, let out on Sunday last in the Asternoon for Paris; but 'tis said he has Orders to stop at Brussels for tome Days.
