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Naples, Octob. 26.

V Hough we had advice from feveral hands of the taking of St. Saluador by the Meffinefes, and that the Governor, and most of the Spiniards had been killed, yet we were here at Court unwilling to give credit thereunto, till we had an account thereof from the Viceroy of that Kingdom, which the Marquis d'Aftorgas received two days finces who hath thereupon haftened the Levies that are making in this Kingdom, to be employed against the Meffinefcs, and hath caused all Veffels that are at prefent here, as well as in other Ports of this Kingdom, to be flopt, for the Transportation of the faid Soldiers, who will not, however, be fo foon ready to embark, through the want here is of money. We are told, that the Spanish Armada, confifting in 20, or 22 men of War, is arrived at Melazzo, and that the Gallies of Spain are likewife fuddenly expected there. It is added, that they intend to fortifie Reggio which lies on the fide of Calabria over against Messina.

Rome, Ollab. 30. The 20 inftant, dyed here the Cardinal Bona in the 63 year of his age, his Body has been interred with the Solemnity usual on fuch occasions, in St. Bernards Church. The 22 the Duke d'Estrees, Ambaffador Extraordinary from his most Christian Majefty, had a private Audience of the Pope. It is reported here, that fome endeavors are ufed to procure a Cardinals Cap for Prince William of Furflenbergh now Prisoner at Vienna, by that means to free him from the danger that at prefent feems to threaten him. We have news here, that the Spanift Armada is arrived at Melaqzo, though we have good reason to doubt it. Our last Letters from Sicily tell us, that the Meffinefes are hard at work about repairing the Fortifications of St. Salvador, and are adding fome new ones for the greater firength of that Poft which is of fogreat importance to shem.

From the Camp at Defvillers Bear Saverne, Nov. 16. The Confederate Troops remain as yet in their quarters at Gerpits not far from Strusburgh, but have to great forcity of Forage, that they are forced to pais the Rhine, and march feveral Leagues to fetch it. Some Prifoners we have lately taken, report, that the Confederates had fent out three parties to make Incursions into the Hpper Our Commissaries have begun to distribute Alfsiia. Hay amongst the Cavalry, who, by that means, are in a much better condition than they were before for want of Just now we receive advice, that the Village of It. Gerpits, by an accidental fire, hath been burnt down to the ground, and that greatest part of the Equipage of the Duke of Bournonville, the Count de Hollach, and Marquis de Bareith hath been lost there. The eleventh Inftant, arrived here two Battalions of French Guards, and the Regiment of Rambure; part of the French Troops which came from Flarders, are at prefent near Feneftranges, where they expect the orders of Monfieur de Turenne. The Nobility of the Arrierban, who have repassed the mountain of Saverne, have some days frace

intrencht themsfelves, having, orders to continue some time longer in Lorrain; the Count de Saula is gone hence to join them. Monsfeur de Turenne has given directions for the working on the Fortifications of Saverne and Haguenaw, with all the diligence possible. The ninth instant, parted from hence the Mareschal de Crequi.

Treves, Novemb. 16. The Enemy having as we understand fince the beginning of this month formed a defign to befiege this place, they have in order to it, already posses of the feveral Posts which are abour us, by that means to block us up. In the interim the Imperialists making in all abour 9 or 10 000 men, under the command of General spork, are marching this way ; with them are to join 2000 Span fb Horfe, commanded by Monfieur de Louvigny, and 3000 Dutch Foot by Major General Fario. The Elector of Treves has caufed a Bridge to be made at Withlie for the piffage of thefe Troops, and for the farther facilitating this defign, has ordered fourteen great pieces of Cannon to be drawn out of the Arfenal at Coblenis, which, with great quantities of all forts of Ammunition, are to be sent down the Mefelle, to be employed in the fiege of this place. Our Governor the Count de Vignory, in the mean time is preparing for a brave defence, having lately received a reinforcement of four Battalions of Foot, and fome Horfe.

Metz, Novemb. 19. Sixteen hundred Gentlemen of the Arrierban are at prefent quartered here, and in the adjacent places; and befides, the Marefchal de Grequi is forming a fmall Army, to oppofe the defigns of the Confederaies, who, under the command of General Spork, are on their march towards Treves, with intention to befiege it: to which purpofe, the fifteen Companies of Guards who fome days fince paffed by this place in order to their going to join with Monslieur de Turenze, have orders to return hither again, to be commanded by Monficur de Grequi.

Charleroy, Novemb. 18. The Imperialifts in thefe parts, upon the inftance of the Emperor, or rather of the Elector of Treves, having formed a defign upon Treves, where they suppose the Frinch Garison to be but weak, and far from any affiftance, have for feveral days past been on their march from their quarters in Brabant, through the Countrey of Liege, having paffed the Meuse at Huy, where they left a Garison of 2000 men, though they could not obtain to have the Caille yielded to them, which General spork very much defi-red, and fent twice to fummon the Governor, with threats that if he furrendzed not the Caffle within 24 hours, he should not expect any quarter, in cafe he made himsch Master of it by force of Arms; but that not having any effect, it was at last agreed that the Castle should be Neutral, neither annoy the Troops in their passage over the Meuse, or be diffurbed by them. It is faid here that the Imperialists will march first to Dinant, to posses themselves (if possible) of the Castle there ; they have likewife a defign to put Garifons into Simay and Rechefort.
