*Petersbourg, September 3:*

**H**ER Imperial Majesty is determined to have the new Winter Palace finished as soon as possible, for which Purpose she has ordered the Soldiers belonging to the two Regiments of Foot of Moscow and Buttirsk, lately arrived here, to be added to the Workmen already employed about that Building. The Great Chancellor Count Bestucheff, who has been for these five or six Weeks past at his Seat in one of the Islands in the Neva, being greatly recovered of his late Indisposition, is returned to Court, and has entred upon the Business of his Office.

*Naples, Sept. 6.* Notwithstanding the Pains taken by several of the Powers of Europe, and particularly by the Pope, to reconcile the Differences between this Court and the Order of Malta, that Affair seems very far from being brought speedily to a Conclusion. The King has not as yet disposed of the important Employment of Viceroy of Sicily.

*Rome, Sept. 9.* The Baron de St. Odil, Minister from the Emperor as Great Duke of Tuscany, has lately had a private Audience of the Pope, in which he requested, that the Bishoprick of Arezzo, now vacant, might not be filled up for the present, but that the Revenues arising from it may be applied towards making a high Road from Sienne to the Confines of the Romagna, which 'tis thought will be the readier complied with, as the Ecclesiastical State will doubtless be greatly benefited by it with Regard to its Commerce.

*Genoa, Sept. 10.* In Consequence of the Treaty lately concluded between this Republick and the Court of Parma, we have began to work upon the high Road which is to be made from Sestri di Levante to the Appennines. Tho' this Enterprize will be attended with great Expence and Trouble, yet the great Advantage that both Parties will receive from it, will be a sufficient Recompence, and the rather, as they will not be obliged to carry their Merchandize

through any of the Dominions of the King of Sardinia.

*Warsaw, Sept. 16.* Preparations are making for holding the approaching General Diet, the opening of which is fixed for the 30th of this Month; but the Divisions among several of the Palatinates of this Kingdom give us great Reason to fear that this Assembly will not prove more successful than the former. Last Monday an Officer arrived here from the Hospodar of Valachia, charged with a private Commission from that Prince to the Count de Branicky, Great General of the Crown Army.

*Stockholm, Sept. 17.* We have received Advice, that their Majesties arrived last Saturday at Grypholm, in the Province of Sudermanland, and propose to return to Drottningholm on the 22d Instant; where they will reside till the Apartments, which are fitting up in the new Palace, are ready for their Reception.

*Vienna, Sept. 18.* We learn by a Courier from Hollitsch, that their Imperial Majesties intend to leave that Place the 23d Instant on their Return to Schonbrun, which they propose to reach by the 26th.

*Frankfort, Sept. 23.* The Deputies of the Circle of the Upper Rhine, who have been assembled in this City for some Weeks past, sent a Deputation last Thursday to Count Pergen, their Imperial Majesties Minister Plenipotentiary, in order to communicate to him the Resolutions taken in that Assembly, the Evening before, on the important Affair of the Coins. We hear from Manheim, that Prince Frederick of Deux Ponts was gone from thence for Vienna, in order to thank their Imperial Majesties for their Interest in procuring him to be chosen Commander in Chief of the Troops of the Circle of Swabia.

*Copenhagen, Sept. 24.* Publick Prayers were put up last Sunday in all the Churches of this City, for the happy Delivery of the Queen, who is near her Time. The Count de Wedel-Fries, who has been lately appointed Envoy Extraordinary from this Court to that of France, in the

Room of Baron Reventlau, will set out some Time next Month for Paris. Ferdinand Anthony de Dannechiold, Count of Laurwieg, his Majesty's Great Master of the Horse, died here last Tuesday, in the 67th Year of his Age.

*Berlin, Sept. 24.* On Sunday last the King returned to Potsdam from his Tour to Silesia, greatly satisfied with the good Condition in which he found the Troops in that Province. His Majesty has disposed of the Regiment of Dragoons of the late Lieutenant General de Schwerin, in Favour of M. Blankensee, on whom he has also conferred the Rank of Major General. His Majesty has likewise conferred on M. Sydow, the Place of Counsellor of the Regency of Randow in Pomerania. We have received an Account, that M. Bock, Great Master of the Waters and Forests in the Marche of Brandebourg, died on the 15th Instant at Custrin, in an advanced Age.

*Mauberge, Sept. 24.* The Body of Troops encamped near Aymeries, under the Command of the Prince de Soubise, will break up the Beginning of next Month, in order to return to their respective Garrisons. The Regiments which compose this Camp, are those of Foot of Bourbonnois, Rohan, Salis, Conde, Buckley, Penthievre, and Rothes, making together 15 Battalions; those of Horse of Colonel-General, Clermont-Tonnerre, Royal, and Bully-Lameth, the first of three, and the other of two Squadrons; those of Dragoons of the Queen, composed of two Squadrons; and five Brigades of Carabineers, making in all 21 Squadrons. The Officers who command in this Camp, under the Prince de Soubise, are M. Du Mesnil, Lieutenant General; and the Prince de Crouy, and M. de La Tout, Marshals de Camp.

*Brussels, Sept. 30.* On Tuesday last the Court went into Mourning for three Months on Occasion of the Death of the Queen Dowager of Portugal. The Duke de Ahremberg, and divers other Noblemen, will set out this Week for Mons, in order to assist at an Assembly of the States of Hainault.

*Hague, Oct. 1.* The States of the Province of Holland have this Day continued their Deliberations; and the Deputies of the several Colleges of the Admiralty are expected here Tomorrow, to consider of the Affairs of their Department. We learn from Utrecht, that M. Mansvelt, Counsellor of the Council of the Regency, and ancient Burgomaster of that City, died there on Friday last, in the 51st Year of his Age.

Whereas the Post Boy, bringing the Kent Mail to this Office, upon Thursday the 28th of February last, was, between the Hours of Eight and Nine of the Clock in the Evening, attacked and robbed, at a Place called Snipps Hill, about a Mile beyond Sittingborn by three Footpads, one of whom fired a Pistol, seized the Horse which carried the Mail, beat the said Post Boy cruelly, and cut the Mail from the Horse and carried it away.

Two of the Persons who committed this Robbery are described as short Men, dressed like Sailors; and the other a tall Man in a red Coat.

This is therefore to give Notice, That whoever shall apprehend and convict, the Persons, or any of them who committed this Robbery, will be intitled to a Reward of Two Hundred Pounds, over and above the

Reward given by Act of Parliament for apprehending of Highwaymen: Or if any Person or Persons, whether Accomplice in the said Robbery, or knowing thereof, do, or shall make Discovery, whereby any one, or more of the Persons, who committed the same, may be apprehended and brought to Justice, such Discoverer, or Discoverers will, upon Conviction of any one, or more, of the said Robbers, be intitled to the same Reward of Two Hundred Pounds, and also have his Majesty's most gracious Pardon.
