Intended to be fent to the Eaft Indies. The Lutheran Families eftablihed in Walachia, having obtained the Grand Seignior's Permiffon to build them-a Church for the publick, Exercife of Religion, have fent Deputies here to collect Mo* ney for carrying on the fame.
Vienna, Sept. 28. On Thurfday laft their Imperial Majeftieq arrived at Schonbrun from Hollitch, with the Archduke, and the reft of the Imperial Family. It is computed there have failed down the Danube, in the Courfe of this Month, upwards of four hundred Families, going from Upper Auffria and Swabia, to rettle in Tranfilvania, where they enjoy the free Exercife of Religion. We have received Advice; that Count Damnitz, who, in the laft Promotion of General Officers, was raifed to the Rank of Field Marthal of her Imperial Majefty's Armies, died at St. Polten, in Lower Auftria, on the 21 ift Inftant.

Frankfort, Sept. 30, The Prince Bifhop of Aughourg, who, in his Return from Bruffels, took the Route of Schwetzingen, in order to vifit the Elector Palatin, arrived here laft Night, and fet out this Morning on his Retorn Home.

Leipfick, Oct. I. The Fair this Year is very brilliant, the Number of Foreign Merchants, and Perfons of Diftinction, that are already arsived, beingequal to thofe of any preceeding Year.

Berlin, Oct. 1. The King has raifed Meff. Klejf, Blankenfee, Retzow, Hulfen and Manflein, to the Rank of Majors General of Foot. Lieutenant General Mollendorff, having obtained Leave to quit the Service, his Majefy has given his Regiment of Dragoons to Count Finkenftein, on whom he has alfo conferred the Rank of Major General.

Mans, Oc7. 3. The States of the Province of Hainault, who have affembled here for fome Days paft, having finifhed their Deliberations, the Duke d'Ahrenberg, their Prefident, is returned to Bruffels. We continue to make Preparations for the Reception of the Princefs Charlotte of Lorrain, who is expected bere towards the End of next Month.

Dufeldort, OCT. 3. Count Harfcamp, late Governor of this City, being difmiffed from that Employment, his Electoral Highnefs has difpofed of the fama in Favour of Lieutenant General Count Bronkhorft-Styrum, who has accordingly taken Poffeffion thereof.

Hague, OEF. 10. The States of Holland and Wefffrizeland are feparated till a new Convocation. We learn by our laft Difpatches from Soeftdyk, that her Royal Highnefs the Princefs Governante, and her Family, continue there in perfect Health, and that her Royal Highnefs propofes to leave that Place next Monday on her Return here. We have received an Account from Middlebourg, of the Death of M, Veth, Counfellor of the Magiftracy of that City.
