Meffina, September 20. CORSAIR from Sallee, that has been cruizing for fome Time in these Seville, referving to himself large Pensions out Seas, has taken a Swedish Ship, valued at about 40000 Pieces of Eight, and conducted her to Tetuan. Waples, Sept. 24. A Knight of the Order of Malta arrived here a few Days ago, and as he has already had feveral Conferences with the Marquess de Fogliani, and other Ministers of this Government, 'tis imagin'd he is charged with fome new Propositions for accommodating the Disputes between this Court and the Grand Master of that Order. The Frigat of 26 Guns, lately launched here, is equipping with all Expedition, in order to join the Squadron of Capt. Martinez, which is now on a Cruize against t the Barbary Pyrates. Genoa, Sept. 28. The Marquels Doria, our new Commissary General in Corfica, has informed the Government, that he has posted his Troops in fuch a Manner, that the Malecontents will be no longer able to raife Contributii ons in the flat Country. In Conformity to the Convention lately concluded between this Republick and the Infant Duke of Parma, they are actually at Work on the new Road that is to open a Communication between each other's Territories, from which great Advantages are expected to arife from Commerce. F Rome, Sept. 28. The Sea having twice demolified and wafhed away the Works which were lately made at Nuttuno, to render that Port more commodious, Orders have been fent to remove the Materials from thence to Civita Vecchia, and totally defift from any Works which are found to be impracticable. On the 16th Inftant the Pope held a private Confiftory, in which he declared Cardinal Serbelloni, to be * Legat of Bologna, and Cardinal Enriquez, to be Legat of Ravenna, and they had their Audiences-of Deave on the 21st, in order to repair to their respective Governments. A few Days ago Cardinal Portocarrero received an extraordinary Courier from his Court, whereupon he immediately had an Audience of the Pope, after

of them; to which, it is faid, the Pope has acquiefced, and that this Event is foon to be made publick. The General of the Order of Mercy has laid before the Secretary of State, a Lift of the Captives redeemed last Year by that Order at Algiers, by which it appears, that they ranfomed 241 Slaves for about 100000 Scudis. Upwards of twenty Persons of Reputation were taken up a few Days ago for Playing at unlawful Games, and were all fentenced to pay confiderable Fines, for the Use of the Hospitals in this City, in order to obtain their Liberty.

In the Afternoon · there was a Race of Chariots, and in the Evening the usual Fireworks, and the Cannon of the Castles; were fired. On this Occasion, Liberty was granted for masking at the Theatre in the Evening, and to continue a Fortnight. Vienna, Oct."5. Yesterday being the Feast of St. Francis, whole Name the Emperor bears, the Ministers of State, Foreign Ministers, and principal Nobility, appeared at Schonbrun in their richeft Habits to compliment their Imperial Majesties on that Occasion. After Divine Service the Emperor and Empress Queen dined in Publick with the Archdukes Joseph and Charles, and the two eldeft Archdutcheffes: The principal Nobility and Foreign Ministers
