

Admiralty-Office, November 4, 1754.

PURsuant to an Act of Parliament passed in the 26th Year of His present Majesty's Reign, this is to give Notice to the Concerned, That Information has been sent to this Office, that a Ship called the Duke of Bourgogne, of Havre de Grace, whereof Piere Francois Rousselin was Master, Burthen One Hundred and Sixty Tons, laden with sundry Goods, bound from Hamburgh to Port Passage near Saint Sebastian, was on the 17th past, by Stress of Weather, drove ashore upon the Knowls, at the Entrance of Woodbridge Haven; but the Goods and other Lading being taken out, she got a Float, and was carried on the 20th into Harwich, where all her Loading was reshipped, except one Chest of Linnen marked D L D, and one Piece of Packing, which were lost in removing the Goods out of the said Ship.

Whereas the Post Boy carrying the Hungerford Branch Mail, dispatched from this Office on Thursday the 10th Instant, was, upon Saturday last, between Morden and Lavington in the County of Wilts, attacked and robbed, by two Highwaymen, who opened the said Mail, and took thereout the Lavington and Timehead Bags of Letters, and likewise took from the Post Boy five Shillings, and otherwise used him very cruelly.

The only Description that is yet come to hand, of the two Persons who committed this Robbery, is, that the one was mounted upon a black Horse or Mare, the other upon a brown one.

This is therefore to give Notice, That whoever shall apprehend and convict, or cause to be apprehended and convicted, the two Persons, or either of them, who committed this Robbery, will be intitled to a Reward of Two Hundred Pounds, over and above the Reward given by Act of Parliament for apprehending of Highwaymen: Or if any Person or Persons, whether Accomplice in the said Robbery, or knowing thereof, do, or shall make Discovery, whereby both, or either of the Persons, who committed the same, may be apprehended and brought to Justice, such Discoverer, or Discoverers will, upon Conviction of the Party or Parties, be intitled to the same Reward of Two Hundred Pounds, and also have his Majesty's most gracious Pardon.
