M. Alt, Minister from the Court of Hesse Cassel, had this Day a private Audience of the King, and delivered a Letter to His Majesty from his most Serene Highness the Landgrave of Hesse Cassel.

Naples, October 16. Yesterday Cardinal Serfale, Archbishop of this City, arrived here from Sorrento. 'Tis said the King has prevailed on the Pope to confer the Cardinal's Hat, that the Infant of Spain is about to resign, on Prince Tarente, his Majesty's Second Son.

Petersburg, Oct. 18. The Great Princess, and the young Prince of whom she was lately delivered, are as well as can be wished. Most of the Regiments that were assembled during the Summer, on the Frontiers of Courland, are going into Winter Quarters in Livonia and Ingria, where they are to hold themselves in Readiness to march, as Circumstances may require. The Great Chancellor Count Bestucheff is confined to his Apartment, but we hope his Indisposition will not be attended with any fatal Consequences.

Leghorn, Oct. 20. The Differences between the King of the Two Sicilies, and the Order of Malta, are upon the Point of being adjusted, on which Account their Ships pass by each other without Molestation. They write from Malta, that one of their Men of War has fallen in with an Algerine Corsair, which she took after a smart Engagement, and has brought her safe into Port.

Rome, Oct. 22. The Small-Pox continues to carry off great Numbers of the Inhabitants of this City. Cardinal Delci has received an Express from Florence, with an Account of the Death of Count Scipion, his Brother, of an Apoplectick Fit. The Persons lately confined in the Castle of St. Angelo, for playing at unlawful Games, were all fined considerable Sums, which they have since paid, and are set at Liberty.

Parma, Oct. 25. Their Highnesses our Sovereigns, who have passed some Time at Sala, are returned to Colorno, where they propose to stay till the End of next Month. The Duke

of Penthièvre, High Admiral of France, is expected here To-morrow or next Day from Genoa, where he landed last Saturday Night.

Stockholm, Oct. 27. Their Majesties set out Yesterday Morning from Drottningholm for Ulrichsdahl, where they propose to reside till the new Palace, that has been building for some Years in this City, is fit for their Reception, which the Workmen have engaged shall be ready by the Beginning of December next at farthest. The Marriage of Baron Hopken with Mademoiselle de Ribbing, one of the Ladies of the Bed-Chamber, has been declared at Court, and will be solemnized in a few Days. Within these two Months past, several Counterfeit Bank Notes for different Sums, have been discovered, and strict Search is making after the Authors of them; but 'tis generally imagined, that they were counterfeited in Finland, and afterwards brought here.

Vienna, Oct. 30. 'Tis said their Imperial Majesties have already declared their Intention of going in the Spring to Trieste, in order to see that the new Regulations, for promoting the Commerce of that Port, are duly carried into Execution. The Opening of the Assembly of the States of Lower Austria is fixed for the 12th of next Month. Yesterday their Imperial Majesties, accompanied by the Archdukes Joseph, Charles, and Peter Leopold, went to the Favourite, and reviewed the Regiment of Cuirassiers of Radicati, which is lately come here to relieve that of Gelhay. They are going to introduce a new Exercise amongst the Imperial Horse, which was lately performed in the Presence of Prince Lichtenstein, and greatly approved.

Copenhagen, Nov. 2. The King continues to go frequently to Jagerbourg, to take the Diversion of Hunting in that Neighbourhood. His Majesty has appointed young Count d'Ostera to be one of the Gentlemen of his Bed-chamber. An Ordonnance is just published, for encouraging and promoting the Art of Refining Sugars in this Kingdom.

Berlin, Nov. 5. The Queen-Mother, who spent best Part of the Summer at Monthijou, came here last Wednesday for the Winter.

Frankfort, Nov. 6. They write from Anspach, that the Margravine, who was lately seized with the Small Pox, is out of Danger.
