The fame Letters add, that the Marriage of the Hereditary Prince of that Name, with the Princels of Saxe-Cobourg, is to be celebrated at Cobourg towards the End of this Month. We have received an Account, that the Princefs Mary Anne of Brnnfwick-Bevern, died a few Days ago in the 26th Year of her Age. We hear from Erbach, that the reigning Countefs of that Name was fafely delivered of a Prince on the 29th of last Month, who was baptized the fame Day by the Name of Francis.

Bruffels, Nov. 10. Prince Charles of Lorrain, and the Princels Charlotte his Sifter, fet out on Thursday last for the Seat of Prince Ligne, where they propose to stay fome Days, and then to continue their Journey for Mons, where the Princess Charlotte of Lorrain intends to refide. On Thursday last Field Marshal Count Chanclos was feized with an Apoplectick Fit, but he is fince greatly recovered. Laft Week M. Haaren, one of the Dutch Commiffaries, returned here from the Hague.

General Post Office, October 14, 1754. Whereas the Post Boy carrying the Hungerford Branch Mail, dispatched from this Office on Thursday the 10th Instant, was, upon Saturday iast, between Morden and Lawington in the County of Wilts, attacked and robbed, by 1900 Highwaymen, who opened the faid Mail, and took thereout the Lawington and Tinebead Bags of Letters, and likewise took from the Post Boy five Shillings, and otherwise used him very cruelly.

The only Description that is yet come to hand, of the two Perjons who committed this Robbery, is, that the one was mounted upon a black Horfe or Mare, the other upon a brown one.

This is therefore to give Notice, That whoever shall apprehend and convict, or cause to be apprehended and convicted, the two Persons, or either of them, who committed this Robbery, will be intitled to a Reward of Two Hundred Pounds, over and above the Reward given by Act of Parliament for apprehending of Highwaymen : Or if any Person or Persons, whether Accomplice in the faid Robbery, or knowing thereof, \_ do, or shall make Discovery, whereby both, or either of the Persons, who committed the same, may be apprehended and brought to Justice, such Discoverer, or Discoverers will, upon Conviction of the Party or Parties, be intitled to the same Reward of Two Hundred Pounds, and also bave bis Majesty's most gracious Pardon.

Utrecht, Nov. 11. M. Mansvelt, ancient Burgomaster of this City, having resigned, on Account of his ill State of Health, the Place he held in the Council of our Regency, her Royal Highne's the Prince's Governante has appointed his Son, M. Abraham Mansvelt, to succeed him;' and Yesterday he took his Seat in the faid Council with the ulual Formalities.

Leyden, Nov. 12. Her Royal Highness the Prince's Governante having appointed M. vander Marck to be Chief Magistrate of this City, he was accordingly installed into that Office last Sunday; and Meffrs. Hoogenhouck, de Bye, de Gerven, and van Buren, were declared Burgomasters. At the same Time M. Schoonhoven was declared Treasurer; and Messres. van de Velde, and Alenfoon, to be Deputies, one to the Chamber of Accompts of the Generality, and the other to the College of the Admiralty of Amsterdam.

Hague, Nov. 12. Sunday being the King of Great Britain's Birth-Day, the fame was obferved here Yesterday, when the Ambassadors, Foreign Minifters, Lords of the Regency, and other Persons of Distinction, went to Court in their tichest Habits, to compliment her Royal Highness the Princess Governante on that Occafion. And in the Evening Col. Yorke, the British Minister, gave a magnificent Supper, and a Ball; to which all Persons of Distinction were invited.
