

Trinity House, Hull, Nov. 27, 1754.

Whereas the Sand in the River Humber, called the Middle, is of late grown up, so as to have but three Feet Water thereon at Low Ebb Tides, Notice is therefore hereby given, That this House have placed a white Buoy upon the Lower or East End of the said Sand, which rides in three Fathoms at Low Water, the Spurn Light House bearing from it East South East, the Buoy of Cleaness South half East one Mile Distance, Grimsby Church West half South, and the Buoy of the Burcom West three Quarters North Distance two Miles. The said Middle Sand is about one Mile and three Quarters long, and about a Quarter of a Mile broad, the North Side thereof is steep too, but the South Side hath gradual Shoaldings, and with Grimsby Church and Mill in one. All Ships may safely cross over the Upper or West-End of the same Sand in three Fathoms at Low Water.
