24 strasburg, Nov. 23. The Confederates Camp is still within two Leagues of this City, though they begin by degrees, to put themselves in their Winter Quarters in the upper Alfatia. Two days fince arrived in the Camp, an Envoye from the Elector of Treves, to give the Elector of Brandenburg, and the other Generals an account of the designe in hand to besiege Treves, praying they would so divert Monsieur de Tarenne, that he might not be able to fend any relief thither. a Party of the Brandenburgh Troops have lately taken the Town and Castle of Thuyn, being a place of smuch importance, it opening the passage through Lorrain into Burgundy, from thence the faid Troops are gone as we are told, to attack Befort, which place the Confederates having possessed themselves of, they will be Mafters of the whole Countrey of Sunigon, and by that means have a free passage into the Franche Courte. The 20 past, Monsieur de Turenne quitted his Camp, and went and posted himself at Inqueiller, in order to his more commodious receiving of Provisions from Lorsain. We hear that feveral Troops are entred into Treves, and have reinforced the French Garrison there. The 15 instant dyed here, the Major-General Post, who Commanded the Troops of the Bilhop of Sunfter.

Serasburg, Nev. 26 Monsieur de Turenne has changed his Quarters, and is at present at Ingweiller, about two Leagues from the place, where he was before; The Confederates continue in their Camp near Strasting, fending out daily considerable parties to take their Quarters in the Upper Alfaria, fo that they have not at present above 10000 in their Camp; it is safily to be thought, that confidering the feafon, both Armies must needs fuffer greatly, through want of Forage, Gt. However, each Party feems resolved to enchire all hardfhips, rather then retire firft; The Troops of the Elector of Brandenburg have taken the Cattle of Thuys, and are marched towards Befort, to poffels themselves likewise of that; his Electoral Highness intends to winter in Colman, and secondingly has giwen directions for the fortifying it. The Elector Palavain is encamped about four Leagues from the Duke of Bournenuille's Quarters, his Troops have raken St. Dammami, and the Castle of Lambers; The Regienest of the Marquis Bareyth, and fome other Troops; have passed the Rhyne, in order to the blocking up of Per partly The Asmirabin the Arrent Philipsburg

Ditte, Nov. 26. The Elector Palatine continues lil with the Confederate Army, and will do so, as long as it remains together. Mondeur de Turenne, has we hear, obliged the Prince of Luzcistein, to receive a french Garrison of 400 Men into his Castle of Lugelftein, where they tound great quantities of all fortsof Provisions. The Elector of Brandenburg having advice, that the Swedish Forces begin to move in Pomeren, and that they feem to look towards his Conntreys, has fent Lieutenant-General Gelit to have a care of things in those parts. The Regiment of Bareyth passed the Rhyne here the 23 instant, with some other Troops, and as is

faid, are gone to block up Philipshourg.

Stratburg, Nov. 30. The Confederate Army is now dispersed into their Winter Quarters; the Brancha burgh Troops in the Upper Alfatia, and will keep their Head Quarter at Colmar, where the Elector of Bran denburg at present is; The Lunenburg Troops in the Lower Assair, and at Schlestadt; The Imperialist in Suntgow, as far as Bafel; and the Lograiners have their quarters from St. Hippolite, through the Valleys, as far as the Frontiers of Lorrain. The French continue, as yet in their Camp at Ingueiller, though it is thought they will now likewise go into their Winter Quarters.

Hamburg, New. 27. The Troops of sweden which were quartered in the Countrey of Bremen, are now on their march towards Pomeren, this day they will pale through the Territories of the Duke of Langsburg. having free passage granted them, and so continue their, march through the Countrey of Mecklenburg to Stetin in Pomerania, where the general Rendezvous is appointed to be the 3 of the next month; several Troops are likewise coming by Sea from Stackholme, and according to computation the Swedes will have an Army of 25000 Men: it is not certainly faid, whither they will take their first march, though the general opinion is, that they will fall into the Ducale Prussia, belonging to the Elector of Brandenburg. that being no part or member of the Empire.

Francfort, Nev. 28. On Monday last the Count Southes, who this Campagne Commanded the Imperial Army in Flanders, arrived here, with a Convoy. of 70 Horse, he was received here with much respect. and towards evening parted again on his way to Vienna. We are told that our Magistrates have raused notice to bu given to the French Resident here, that the Empe-ror and Empire expects he should leave this City. and at the same time it is said, that the Abbe de Gravelle, the French Minister as Mayence, is preparing likewise to depart from thence.

Antwerp, Dec. 4. We have advice here, that the Duke d'Enguienis by Command of his most Chaillan Majesty, coming into the French Conquests in these. parts, and that he brings feveral Troops with him, and at the fame time we are gold, that the French are affembling a Body of an Army rogether about Ips; upon notice whereof, the Count de Monterey, as they write from Bruffels has caused a Placaet to be published, friedy commanding all Officers, forshwith to re-pair to their feyeral Garrhons; and belides, his Excellency
