Ratisbon, Dec. 2. On Thursday last the Elector of Mentz carried a Letter from the Emperor to the publick Dictature, by which his Imperial Majesty approves of the Choice lately made of Prince Lewis of Furstenberg, to fill up the vacant Post of General of the Artillery of the Empire.

Hambourg, Dec. 10. We just learn by Letters from Bremen, that last Friday Night, between Eleven and Twelve, a Fire broke out at a Tanners, which from the Violence of the Wind communicated itself (though at a confiderable Distance) to the Parish-Church of St. Stephens, which has been confumed to the very Walls; and from the Sparkles of which fix Houses in different Parts of the City have been laid in Ashes. This Church was their largest Edifice, and the most esteemed for its Anchie tecture.
