

*Petersbourg, Dec. 21.* The Great Princess has been indisposed for some Days past, and obliged to keep her Bed; upon which it is currently reported, that her Highness is again with Child.

*Paris, Jan. 13.* On the 4th Instant, the King invested the Marquês de Bezons, Count Lillebonne, the Marquês de la Chatre, Count Valentinois, the Chevalier de Villefort, the Sieur Montfort, and the Sieur Valcourt, with the Ensigns of the Royal and Military Order of St. Louis.

*Hague, Jan. 21.* The States of this Province, who opened their Assembly on Wednesday last, have this Day continued their Deliberations. We hear from Bommel, that Count Hogendorp, and M. Aldewereld, Lord of Heervliet, are appointed Deputies Extraordinary from the Province of Guelderland, to the Assembly of the States General. The Marquês de Grimaldi, Ambassador from Spain to this Court, is shortly expected here, some of his Excellency's Domesticks being already arrived with Part of his Baggage.
