AT the Court at St. James's the 3d Day of February 1755,

PRESENT,

The King's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

His Majesty in Council was this Day pleased to appoint Thomas Bayly, of Morend, Esq; to be Sheriff of the County of Gloucester.

Lisbon, Dec. 27. The Fleet bound for Fernambuco, confisting of fourteen Merchantmen, under the Convoy of a Man of War, put to Sea last Saturday with a fair Wind. The same Day three Ships sailed from hence for Paraiba, three for Cape Verd, and one for Angola, Don Miranda Henriquez, the new Governor of the Province of Siara in the Brasils, who went on board one of the Ships for Paraiba, has taken with him a great Number of experienced Miners, in order to work the Silver Mines lately difcovered there, which 'tis thought will prove very advantageous. We have received Advice, that a Spanish Register Ship, from Honduras, with 200,000 Pieces of Eight, besides a very valuable Cargo of Merchandize on board, is put in at the Maderas, in order to repair the Damages she received in three violent Storms, after which the will proceed to Cadiz. The intended Marriage of the Infant Don Pedro, with the Princess of Brasil, was not declared at Court on that Princes's Birth-Day, as was expected.

Petersbourg, Jan. 4. Last Sunday, being the Birth-Day of her Imperial Majesty, the same was celebrated at Court with the utmost Splendor and Magnificence; but no Military

Promotion was made on that Day. Rome, Jan. 8. The Marquess de Cera, M. Grassi, and Count Dandini, who a few Days ago were elected Conservators of the Roman People for the Year ensuing, have taken the Oaths of Fidelity from the Hands of the Pope, to qualify themselves to execute their respective Offices. Publick Prayers are put up in the principal Churches of this City, on Account of the Disputes between the Clergy and Parliaments of France, befeeching the Almighty to reffore Peace to the Church in that Kingdom.

Genoa, Jan. 9. They write from Barcelona, that his Catholick Majesty has appointed the Infant Don Louis, his Brother, to be General of the Troops, and Inspector of the Fortifications, of the Spanish Monarchy. We are assured, that Orders are sent to M. Guastaldi, our Minister at the Court of Turin, to make the strongest Representations to the King of Sardinia, against the Refuge given to the Inhabitants of San-Remo and Campo-Freddo, in his Majesty's Territories. We have received an Account, that a French Ship, bound from Mersailles to the Levant, has been lately taken by a Corsair belonging to Sallee.

Parma, Jan. 10. The Abbe Count de Bernis, Ambassador from France to the Republick of Venice, who has been here for some Days, has had feveral private Conferences with the Infant Duke our Sovereign, which gives Room for Suspicion, that this Minister is charged with some important Commission at this Court, We are informed by our last Letters from Turin. that the King of Sardinia made a numerous Promotion of Military Officers on New-Year's Day.

Milan, Jan. 13. On Monday last there was a surprizing Concourse of Persons of both Sexes at the Ducal Palace, to take their Leave of the Duke of Modena, who set out on Tuesday Morning for the Capital of his own Dominions. We have received Advice, that Cardinal Tempi, heretofore the Pope's Nuncio at the Court of Lisbon, is arrived at Florence, where he proposes to stay with his Family till the End of this Month, and then to proceed to Rome, in order to receive the Cardinal's Hat from the Pope's own Hands.

Stockholm, Jan. 14. Last Saturday the King held a Chapter of the Order of the Sword, when his Majesty created several new Knights of that Order. We hear from Ahmol in Dalecarlia, that the Steeple of the Church of that Town fell down on the 23d of last Month, and greatly damaged the Body of the Church.

Copenhagen, Jan. 17. The Queen, who is in perfect Health, is daily expected to be brought to Bed.

Frankfort, Jan. 22. Prince Frederick Eugene of Wittembourg arrived here last Night

with the Princess his Spouse, and To-morrow they continue their Route for Stuttgard. We have received an Account, that the Margravine of Baden-Baden died on the 12th Instant, at the Castle of Rastadt, in the 49th Year of her Age. The raising of Recruits for the Service of the Queen of Hungary, and the King of Prussia, goes on very successfully in this City and its Neighbourhood.

Berlin, Jan. 23. The King has appointed Count Henry Reder, to be President of the Chamber of the Regency of Oppelen, in the Room of Count Charles Reder, who obtained Leave of his Majesty to resign that Employment.

Hague, Jan. 28. The States of this Province are separated till a new Convocation, after having agreed to the raising the same publick Taxes and Duties as were collected last Year.
