*Petersbourg, January 4.*

**T**HE Military Promotion, that was expected to have been made on the Empress's Birth-Day, will be declared at Court on Saturday next, when, amongst others General Butterlin, the Knees Trubetzkoï, General Apraxin, and the Generals Alexander and Peter Schwaloff, will be appointed Field Marshals; and the Prince of Holstein Beck, Baron Lieven, and the Counts Brown and Fermor, Lieutenant Generals. 'Tis said the Field Marshals Apraxin and Peter Schwaloff, are to have the Command of all her Imperial Majesty's Forces; and that General Butterlin will be appointed Governor of Kiovia, and the Knees Trubetzkoï, Governor of the Province of Livonia. A new Code of Law is soon to be made publick, which is hereafter to be followed throughout this Empire, and 'tis expected a new Tariff will be introduced at the same Time. They have sent out Detachments from the several Regiments quartered in the different Provinces of her Imperial Majesty's Dominions, in order to raise Recruits for completing the said Regiments.

*Prague, Jan. 8.* Last Week the Weather was so excessive cold in this Country, that several Persons were found dead upon the Roads. The Frost still continues, but is not quite so severe. It is currently reported here, that her Imperial Majesty intends to pay us a Visit in the Spring, and that she will be accompanied by the eldest Archduchess.

*Venice, Jan. 10.* An Account is arrived here, that Cardinal Querini, Bishop of Bresse, died on Tuesday last in his Episcopal Palace, after a short Illness.

*Warsaw, Jan. 11.* Prince Czartorisky, and Count Flemming, the one Great Chancellor, and the other Great Treasurer, of the Dutchy of Lithuania, are arrived here to partake of the Diversions of the Carnival. We are informed by our last Letters from Podolia, that the Body of Ottoman Troops, which lately assembled on the Frontiers of Walachia, are marched into Winter Quarters, and that the Hospodar of that

Province, and of Moldavia, have both expressed great Satisfaction at the Methods that have been taken to settle the Affair of the Estates of the Ordination of Ostrog. The King has caused an Order to be sent into the several Palatinates of this Kingdom, bordering upon Russia, expressly forbidding all the Officers of his Regiments in those Parts, to receive any Deserters whatsoever from the Russian Troops. We have received Advice, that the Marriage of Prince Radzivil, Standard Bearer of the Dutchy of Lithuania, with the Daughter of Count Migazinsky, Palatin of Czernichow, was celebrated at the Castle of Kronickzyn, on the 1st of this Month, with great Magnificence. Count Rzewosky, Palatin of Podlachia, died a few Days ago at his Country Seat.

*Munich, Jan. 16.* On Tuesday arrived here the Marquess d'Azlor, heretofore Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from the Court of Spain to that of Vienna, and Yesterday he was introduced to the Elector our Sovereign, and to the Elector of Cologne. He proposes to stop here about a Week, and then to continue his Journey for Madrid. The Baron de Widmann is also arrived here from Wurtzbourg, where he assisted, in Quality of Imperial Commissary, at the Election that was made on the 7th Instant, of a new Prince-Bishop.

*Turin, Jan. 16.* M. Guastaldi, the new Genoese Minister to this Court, who arrived here a few Days ago, has already had his Audiences of the King and the rest of the Royal Family.

*Naples, Jan. 17.* The Differences which have subsisted for a long Time between this Court and the Order of Malta, are at length amicably adjusted; and the King has sent the Articles of Accommodation to the Pope, to whom his Majesty has notified, that he will give immediate Orders, not only for opening the Commerce between his Dominions and that Island; but also for taking off the Sequestration that was made of the Revenues of the Commanderies possessed by the Knights of that Order in Naples and Sicily. A few Days ago one hundred Recruits arrived

arrived here from Albano, in order to compleat the Second Battallion of the Regiment of Royal Macedonia. Mount Vesuvius continues to throw out great Quantities of Fire; which runs off in Torrents. This keeps the neighbouring Inhabitants in the utmost Consternation. A great Number of Foreigners are arrived, and others continually coming to see this new Eruption.

Vienna, Jan. 18. The Marquess d'Azlor, Minister Plenipotentiary from his Catholic Majesty to this Court, set out from hence this Week on his Return to Madrid. Last Sunday young Count Wurmbrand was married at Court to the Countess of Aversperg, in the Presence of their Imperial Majesties, the Ceremony being performed by Prince Trautson our Archbishop. The Weather being very cold, and the Frost like to continue, her Imperial Majesty has caused a large Quantity of Firing to be distributed amongst the poor Inhabitants of this City.

Dresden, Jan. 20. The King has named M. Erdmansdorff, and his Chamberlains the Counts Bunar and Hoymb, to be of his Privy-Council. The Frost is set in with us as severe as has been known for some Years; and the Strength and Thickness of the Ice upon the Elb is such, that it admits not only Persons on Foot, but even Horsemen and Carriages to cross any Part of it without the least Danger.

Hague, Jan. 30. The States General have caused a Placard to be published, appointing the 19th of March next, to be kept as a Day of publick Fasting and Thanksgiving throughout these Provinces.
