**T**HEIR Catholick Majesties continue in their Palace of Buen Retiro, in good Health, as do also at St. Ildefonso, the Queen Dowager, and the Infant Don Louis. Several Operas have already been represented at Court, since the Beginning of this Carnaval, and will be repeated during the remaining Part of the Season. Some Days ago died here, after a lingering Illness, in the 62d Year of her Age, the Dutchess of Alva; by whose Death the Title, and great Estates, belonging to that illustrious House, are devolved upon her only Son, the Duke of Huefcar, Mayor-Domo-Major to his Catholick Majesty. Last Week an Express arrived from Cadiz, with the News, that on the 5th of this Month, entered into that Bay, the Register Ship called the Victoriouso, returning from Callao de Lima, and the Ship Nuestra Señora del Carmen, from San Thomas de Castilla in the Bay of Honduras, the Cargo of the former consisting of 1,208708 Dollars in coined and worked Silver, and 674819 Dollars in Gold, besides Fruits and Merchandizes; and that of the latter of 111692 Dollars in Gold and Silver Coin, with other Effects.
