Copenhagen, January 5.

THE King, who went to Friedensbourg the Beginning of last Week, returned here on Friday; and that Night there was a grand Appearance at Court of the Nobility and Gentry. The Queen continues in perfect Health, and we are in daily Expectation of her Delivery. They talk already of forming a Camp next Summer; and Orders are shortly expected to be issued for furnishing the necessary Magazines of Provision and Forage for that Purpose.

Genoa, Jan. 12. The Government have caused an Ordonnance to be published, for regulating the intrinsic Value of the different Species of Gold and Silver Coin, current in this Republick. We have had a very severe Frost for some Days past; during which the contrary Winds have prevented the Arrival of any Foreign Ships in this Port.

Rome, Jan 16. Last Week the Duke de Penthièvre, High Admiral of France, set out from hence for Naples, where he proposes to stay some Time. Cardinal Ricci, who has been for some Months in a declining State of Health, died here a few Days ago, in the 66th Year of his Age.

Petersbourg, Jan. 17. On Sunday last being New-Years Day according to the Kalendar used in this Empire, the Empress received the Compliments of the Nobility and Gentry on that Occasion; after which her Imperial Majesty dined in Publick with the Great Duke; and at Night there was a Ball and a Firework. The same Day her Imperial Majesty declared the Count de Loser, Hereditary Marshal of the Electorate of Saxony, and General Arnimb, heretofore the Saxon Minister at this Court, to be Knights of the Order of St. Andrew.

Stockholm, Jan. 24. Their Majesties and the Royal Family continue their Residence at

the new Palace in this City. The King has lately disposed of several Employments vacant in the Regiments of Abo, Cronhielm, Nericie, and Elsbourg.

Strasbourg, Jan. 27. The Regiment of Dragoons of Dauphin, together with that of Hussars of Poleresky, and the Regiments of Foot of Diezbach and Alsace, are all marched from their respective Quarters in quest of a large Gang of Smuglers, who have appeared lately at Epinoy and other Towns in Lorraine, where 'tis feared they will commit as great Disorders as they have done in several Provinces of this Kingdom.

Hanau, Jan. 28. We are informed by our last Letters from the Weteraw, that Major General Baron Briedenbach, in the Hanoverian Service, died at the Castle of Friedberg on the 21st Instant, after four Months illness.

Hambourg, Jan. 28. Prince Galliczin the Russian Envoy in this Residence, gave the 21st Instant an Entertainment to the Foreign Ministers and Nobility, upon the Occasion of the Birth of the young Prince Paul Petrowitz; and the Magistracy of this City having been invited, a Syndic and two Members were deputed from the Senate to assist at it. And the Friday following M. de Galliczin gave a publick Masquerade. M. Kurschof, a Captain in the Empress of Russia's Guards, who has been at Zerbst to notify the Birth of the Prince, is arrived here, in order to acquit himself of the like Commission to her Highness the Dutchess Dowager of Holstein, who resides in Hambourg.

Vienna, Feb. 1. Within these few Days past several Couriers have arrived here from Foreign Courts, whose Dispatches have occasioned the holding of divers Councils in their Imperial Majesties Presence. Count Stadion is also arrived here, being charged with the Commission of receiving from the Hands of the Emperor, the Investiture of the Temporalities of the new Prince

Prince Bishop of Bamberg. The Regiment of Foot of Colloredo, which made Part of this Garrison, is marched from hence, and is replaced by that of Count Léopold Daun. Prince Lichtenstein, who came here a few Days ago to assist at a Council of War, is returned to Presbourg. On Monday last a great Number of Workmen went from hence for Hungary, in order to be employed in repairing the Fortifications in that Kingdom. The Weather continues so very severe in this Country, that notwithstanding the Centinals were ordered by her Imperial Majesty to be relieved every half Hour, two of them have since died with Cold.

Hanover, Feb. 2. We flattered ourselves that the Severity of the Weather would have put an End to the Distemper amongst the horned Cattle in this Country; but notwithstanding the hard Frost we have had for some Days past, we hear the Distemper continues to spread itself in the Dutchies of Bremen and Verden.

Cologne, Feb. 6. The States of the Dutchies of Juliers and Burgues, who have assembled for some Time past at Dusseldorp, are at length separated, after having agreed to the Supplies demanded of them by the Elector Palatin.

Brussels, Feb. 6. Prince Charles of Lorraine, our Governor General, has disposed of a Company, vacant in his Regiment, to the young Count Chancelos, Son to the Field Marshal of that Name. The Princess Charlotte of Lorraine, who has been here best Part of the Carnival, is returned to Mons.

Hamburg, Feb. 7. The Aga from Tunis, who has been some Months at Copenhagen, buying up of Horses for the Dey, arrived the Day before Yesterday in the Suburbs of Hamburg, with about fifty Horses, Part of which passed the Elbe Yesterday, and the Remainder were to cross as To-day. He has with him three Horses which his Danish Majesty sends as a Present to the Dey; and the Aga with his Caravan goes from hence by Land to Marseilles, from which Port he will embark for Tunis.

Hague, Feb. 11. Her Royal Highness the Princess Governante has appointed M. Chalmers to be Captain of a Company in the Regiment of Lieutenant General Halkett. Her Royal Highness has also appointed M. Sprengler to be Captain of a Company in the Regiment of Brakel. A few Days ago M. Acques, Counsellor and Burgomaster of the City of Delft, took his Seat in the Assembly of the States General on the Part of this Province, being introduced by Count Bentinck. The States of this Province are to assemble on the 19th Instant. M. Virtrarius, Counsellor of the High Court of Justice of Holland, Zealand and Westfrizeland, died here suddenly on Wednesday Night last.
