Hamburgh, Feb. 7. The Aga from Tunis, who has been fome Months at Copenhagen, buying up of Horses for the Dey, arrived the Day before Yesterday in the Suburbs of Hamburgh, with about fifty Horses, Part of which passed the Elbe Yesterday, and the Remainder were to crois as To-day. He has with him three Horses which his Danish Majesty sends as a Prefent to the Dey; and the Aga with his Caravan goes from hence by Land to Marfeilles, from which Port he will embark for Tunis.
