The King's most Excellent Majesty in Council. His Majesty in Council was this Day pleased Whitehall, March 29. The King has been pleased to grant to his Grace Lionel Duke of Dorset, the Office of Master of His Majesty's Horse.

The King has been pleased to conffitute and appoint Joseph Yorke, Esq; to be Colonel of the Regiment of Foot, whereof John Waldegrave, Esq; was late Colonel, and likewise Captain of a Company in the faid Regiment.

to declare the Right Honourable William Lord Cavendifh of Hardwyck, (commonly called Marquefs of Hartington) Lieutenant General and General Governor of His Majefty's Kingdom of Ireland.

Whereas His Majefty was gracioufly pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Eleventh Day of this Instant March, to promise and declare, (amongst other Things) that the Bounties of three Pounds for every Able Scaman, of Forty Shillings for every. Ordinary Seaman, and of Twenty Shillings for every Ablebodied Landman, should be paid to every such Seaman and Landman respectively, who should, on or before the Thirty-first Day of this Instant, voluntarily Enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy; and that a Reward of Two Pounds should be also paid to any Person who should, on or before the faid Thirty-first Day of this Instant, discover any Seaman, or Seamen, who fhould conceal themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's faid Service—And whereas the Time thereby limited for paying the faid Bounties and Rewards is now near expiring; and it being judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, that the same should be continued for some longer Time: His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore Order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, That the 'Time' limited by the faid Proclamation for Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards, be prolonged and extended from the faid Thirty-first Day of this Instant March, to the Thirtieth Day of April . next, inclusive -- Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice and govern themfelves ac-

Whitehall, March 22, 1755.

Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, that, some Time in February last, the House of Mr. Harrington, of Great Tay in Effex, was broke open, and a Quantity. of Money taken out, by five Persons, who answer the following Description: One young Man, five Feet three Inches high, full faced, pale Complexion, round visaged, brown Eyes, had on a dark drab Horseman's Coat, a light grey cut Wig, booted, rode a good black Horfe or Mare, upwards of fifteen Hands high; the second a sout middle-aged Man, about five Feet fix Inches high, full faced, fresh coloured, round wisaged, had on a Scotch Plaid Waistcoat, a dark coloured Horseman's Coat, booted, rode a black Hobby, near fourteen Hands high, with a Hog Mane and Short cut Tail; the third a round shouldered middle-aged Man, about five Feet four Inches bigh, small Visage, full eyed, ruddy Complexion, his Size small, had on a Plaid Waistcoat, a dark grey Wig, a Piece of red Cloth under his Chin, wore a very dark Horseman's Coat, and was booted, rode a wery scrubby forrel lean Horse, about fifteen Hands high; the fourth, a young Man, about twenty four Years of 'Age, pockfretten, long visaged, long Nose, thin faced, pale Complexion, about sive Feet six Inches Ligh, thin in Person, had on a Stock, an old surtout Coat, double breasted Coat with metal Buttons, wery bad Boots, rode a good black Horse, with many filver Hairs on his Mane, Tail and Rump, and some spread all over him, about fifteen Hands and a Half high; the fifth, a young Man, under Age, near fix Feet bigh, thin bodied, round faced, light brown Hair, carls very well, fresh C mplexion, had on a bad Fustian Frock, a good dark coloured Horseman's Coat, booted, and rode a shabby Horse, about fourteen Hands bigb, of a bay Colour, short clipped Tail, hanging darkift Mane : His Majefty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Person or Persons concerned in the said Robberg, is pleased to promise His most gractous Pardon to This Person therein concerned; white frall discover bis Accomplice
