Constantinople, March 1. Aly Pascha is coming hither from Trebizonde, but the Roads are fo bad, that it is thought it will be 10 of 15 Days before he can arrive. The Dey of Algier has fent hither feveral Christian Slaves, Blacks, and Wild Beaffs, as a Prefent to the Grand Seignor, who in Return has given him fome Cannon and Ammunition, and affured him of his Protection.
