On the 24th past, departed this Life, after a tedious and painful Illness, the late Bashaw; he died about Six in the Evening, and at Seven his eldeft Son Sidi Ali was installed, and fat in the Chair of State; at Ten the fame Evening he was proclaimed through the City, and early next Morning, the Divan, Officers of State, and all Ranks of People within 20 Miles of this Capital, paid him their respective Congratulations; as did likewife all the European Confuls; and, according to the Eastern Stile, every one carried with him a Prefent. This Prince is posseful of the univerfal Affection and Efteem of all Degrees of People. He is now about 23 Years of Age, of a very affable Presence and Behaviour, Temperate, Just, and an utter Enemy to all Man-ner of Vice.
