The King's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Eleventh Day of this Instant March, to promise and declare, (amongst other Things) that the Bounties of three Pounds for every Able Seaman, of Forty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, and of Twenty Shillings for every Able-bodied Landman, should be paid to every such Seaman and Landman respectively, who should, on or before the Thirty-first Day of this Instant, voluntarily Enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy; and that a Reward of Two Pounds should be also paid to any Person who should, on or before the said Thirty-first Day of this Instant, discover any Seaman, or Seamen, who should conceal themselves, so that such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's said Service—And whereas the Time thereby limited for paying the said Bounties and Rewards is now near expiring; and it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the same should be continued for some longer Time: His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore Order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, That the Time limited by the said Proclamation for Payment of the said Bounties and Rewards, be prolonged and extended from the said Thirty-first Day of this Instant March, to the Thirtieth Day of April next, inclusive—Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice and govern themselves accordingly.

G O D Save the KING.

Tripoly in Barbary, Aug. 17. On the 24th past, departed this Life, after a tedious and painful Illness, the late Bashaw; he died about Six in the Evening, and at Seven his eldest Son Sidi Ali was installed, and sat in the Chair of State; at Ten the same Evening he was proclaimed through the City, and early next Morning, the Divan, Officers of State, and all Ranks of People within 20 Miles of this Capital, paid him their respective Congratulations; as did likewise all the European Consuls; and, according to the Eastern Stile, every one carried with him a Present. This Prince is possessed of the universal Affection and Esteem of all Degrees of People. He is now about 23 Years of Age, of a very affable Presence and Behaviour, Temperate, Just, and an utter Enemy to all Manner of Vice.

Tripoly in Barbary, January 25. On the 7th of October last, the Bashaw renewed and confirmed all former Treaties subsisting between His Britannick Majesty and this State.

Lisbon, Feb. 28. Their Majesties are returned from Salvaterra to their Palace in this City. On the 16th Instant, a Dutch Ship, at Anchor in this Road, took Fire, and was greatly damaged, but most of her Lading was saved. The Fleet bound for the Bay of All Saints is already equipped; and that for Maragnan and Para will be ready to put to Sea in a few Days. The King has ordered the Sum of fourscore thousand Cruzades to be paid to the Religious of the Order of Mercy, to enable them to ransom such of his Majesty's Subjects who are in Slavery at Algiers or elsewhere upon the Coast of Barbary.

Naples, March 13. The King's Chebecks, which, on Account of the late tempestuous Weather, were obliged to return into Port,

will

will sail again forthwith, in order to continue their Cruize against the Barbary Pyrates, who greatly interrupt the Navigation of these Seas.

Bonn, March 29. A few Days ago a large Gang of Robbers, who have committed great Disorders in the flat Country, were apprehended in the Neighbourhood of Steinfeld, and committed to Prison.

Vienna, March 22. The Empress Queen has appointed Count Bethlem to be Chancellor of Transilvania; and Count Neuperg is ordered to repair forthwith to Croatia, in order to carry into Execution some new Military Regulations. Their Imperial Majesties have named General Kheil to be one of their Actual Privy Counsellors.

Frankfort, March 19. Yesterday Morning the Waters of the Main overflowed the Banks of that River, occasioned by the sudden melting of a prodigious Quantity of Snow, by which several large Tracts of Land, in the Neighbourhoods of Hanau and Aschaffenburg, were laid under Water.

Hague, April 3. Her Royal Highness the Princess Governante has appointed M. Arkel to be Governour of Gertruydenbourg, in the Room of Major General Bigot, Mess. de Wybourg and de Dieu, having been named Counsellors, the one of the College of the Admiralty of Friseland, and the other of that of Amsterdam, they were Yesterday sworn into their respective Employments.
