HEREAS His Majefty was gra-cioufly pleafed, by His Royal Pro-clamation bearing Date the Eleventh Day of this Instant March, to pro-

mile and declare, (amongst other Things) that the Bounties of three Pounds for every Able Sea-man, of Forty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, and of Twenty Shillings for every Ablebodied Landman, should be paid to every such Seaman and Landman respectively, who should, on or before the Thirty-first Day of this Instant, voluntarily Enter themselves to ferve in His Majesty's Royal Navy; and that a Reward of Two Pounds fhould be also paid to any Person who should, on or before the faid Thirty-first Day of this Inftant, discover any Seaman, or Seamen, who should conceal themselves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majefty's faid Service-And whereas the Time thereby limited for paying the faid Bounties and Rewards is now near expiring; and it being judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, that the fame fhould be continued for fome longer Time: His Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore Order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, That the Time limited by the faid Proclamation for Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards, be prolonged and extended from the faid Thirty-first Day of this Instant March, to the Thirtieth Day of April next, inclusive – Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice and govern themfelves accordingly.

## GOD Save the KING.

Tripoly in Barbary, Aug. 17. On the 24th paft, departed this Life, after a tedious and painful Illness, the late Bashaw ; he died about Six in the Evening, and at Seven his eldeft Son Sidi Ali was installed, and fat in the Chair of State; at Ten the fame Evening he was proclaimed through the City, and early next Morning, the Divan, Officers of State, and all Ranks of People within 20 Miles of this Capital, paid him their respective Congratulations; as did likewife all the European Confuls; and, according to the Eastern Stile, every one carried with him a Prefent. This Prince is posseful of the univerfal Affection and Eftcem of all Degrees of People. He is now about 23 Years of Age, of a very affable Prefence and Behaviour, Temperate, Just, and an utter Enemy to all Man-ner of Vice.

His Britannick Majefty and this State. Lisbon, Feb. 28. Their Majefties are returned from Salvaterra to their Palace in this On the 16th Instant, a Dutch Ship, at City.
