Frankfort, March 19. Yesterday Morning the Waters of the Main overflowed the Banks of that River, occasioned by the sudden melting of a prodigious Quantity of Snow, by which several large Tracts of Land, in the Neighbourhoods of Hanau and Aschaffenburg, were laid under Water.

Hague, April 3. Her Royal Highness the Princess Governante has appointed M.
