Berlin, April 18. We hear from Breflau, the Capital of Silefia, that, on the the 4th Inftant, the Inhabitants of that City were greatly alarmed by a Fire's breaking out over-against the Gate of Schweidnitz, on Account of 2 Magazine of Gunpowder being in the Neighbourhood, the blowing up of which must have done great Damage, but providentially the Wind carried the Flames from it, and the Fire was extinguished with the Loss of about 12 Houles.
