THEREAS His Majesty was gra. ciously pleased. by His Order in ciously pleased, by His Order in Council of the Twenty-seventh Day of March last, to direct, That the Bounties given by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Eleventh Day of the fame Month, of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, of Forty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, and of Twenty Shillings for every Able-bodied Landman, should be continued to be paid to every fuch Seaman and Landman respectively, who should, or or before the Thirtieth Day of this Inffant April, voluntarily Enter themselves; to ferve: in His Majefty's Royal Navy; and that a Reward of Two Pounds, likewife given by the faid Freclamation, fliould be continued to be paid to any Person, who should, on or before the faid Thirtieth Day of this, Instant, difcover any Seaman, or Seamen, who should conceal themselves, fo that such Seaman or Seamen should be taken for His Majesty's said Service—And whereas the Time limited by His Majeffy's faid Order in Council, for paying the faid Bounties and Rewards, is now near expiring; and His Majefty's Service requiring that the fame should be continued for some longer Time: His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore Order, and it is hereby Ordered, That the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards, be prolonged and extended from the faid Thirtieth Day of this Instant April, to Tuesday the Twenty-feventh Day of May next inclusive. -Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.
