P R E S E N T,

The Lords Justices in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Twenty-sixth of April last, for paying the respective Bounties therein mentioned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and also to all Able-bodied Landmen, who should voluntarily Enter themselves in His Majesty's Royal Navy; and likewise for paying Rewards to Persons discovering any Seamen who should conceal themselves, will expire upon this Day: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the Bounties and Rewards thereby given, should be continued to be paid for some longer Time—The Lords Justices do therefore Order, and it is hereby Ordered, with the Advice of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy-Council, that the Bounty of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, of Forty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, and of Twenty Shillings for every Able-bodied Landman, be continued to be paid to such Seamen and Landmen respectively, who shall enter themselves in the Royal Navy on or before the Twenty-fourth Day of June next; and that the Reward of Forty Shillings to Persons discovering any Able Seaman or Seamen, who shall conceal themselves, so that such Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majesty's said Service, be likewise continued to be paid until the said Twenty-fourth Day of June next inclusive.—Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

Naples, May 6. On Sunday last one of our Chebecks belonging to the Squadron under the Command of Commodore Martinez, who has been cruizing for some Time past on the Coasts of this Kingdom, returned into Port with a small Corfair which she took in the Canal of Piombino. The Crew of the said Corfair consists of 30 Persons, who are all put in Irons.

Petersbourg, May 6. Yesterday Morning the Empress went from the Winter Palace to that of the Summer, where the Envoy Extraordinary from the Grand Signior was soon after admitted to his first publick Audience. And to Day, being the Anniversary of her Imperial Majesty's Accession to the Throne, she was complimented thereupon by the Great Duke and Great Dutchess, and by all the principal Nobility; and at Night there was a Ball at Court which the Empress honoured with her Presence.

Venice, May 13. We are informed by our last Dispatches from Constantinople, that the new Grand Signior continues his Intention of living in Friendship with the Christian Powers, and particularly with this Republick.

Aranjuez, May 19. His Catholick Majesty has been slightly indisposed with a Rheumatick Pain in his Arm, but is entirely relieved from

it at present. The Negotiation, that has been carried on for some Time between Spain and the Court of Rome, relating to the Pensions reserved for the Infant Don Louis out of the Ecclesiastick Benefices which he lately resigned, is now concluded to the Satisfaction of his Catholick Majesty.

Brussels, May 24. Prince Charles of Lorraine, our Governor General, who went last Saturday to Mons, to compliment his Sister on the Anniversary of her Birth-Day, returned here from thence on Monday Night.

Amsterdam, May 28. The Phoenix Man of War, commanded by Captain d'Idinga, and the Sea Horse, commanded by Captain Decker, put to Sea on Monday last for the Mediterranean, and have taken under their Convoy all the trading Vessels bound that Way.

Hambourg, May 30. The Syndic Klefeker, who was deputed, on the Part of this Republick, to compliment the King of Great Britain upon his Arrival in his German Dominions, is returned from Hanover, where he met with a very gracious Reception.
