**THEREAS** the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Twenty-fixth of April last, for paying the respective Bounties therein mentioned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and also to all Able-bodied Landmen, who should voluntarily Enter themselves in His Majefty's Royal Navy ; and likewife for paying Rewards to Perfons difcovering any Seamen who should conceal themselves, will expire upon this Day : And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the Bounties and Rewards thereby given, should be continued to be paid for fome longer Time—The Lords Juffices do therefore Order, and it is hereby Ordered, with the Advice of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy-Council, that the Bounty of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, of Forty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, and of Twenty Shillings for every Able-bodied Landman, be continued to be paid to fuch Seamen and Landmen respectively, who shall enter themselves in the Royal Navy on or before the Twenty-fourth Day of June next; and that the Reward of Forty Shillings to Perfons difcovering any Able Seaman or Seamen, who shall conceal themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majesty's said Service, be likewife continued to be paid until the faid Twentyfourth Day of June next inclusive.—Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.
