P R E S E N T,

The Lords Justices in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Twenty-sixth of April last, for paying the respective Bounties therein mentioned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and also to all Able-bodied Landmen, who should voluntarily Enter themselves in His Majesty's Royal Navy; and likewise for paying Rewards to Persons discovering any Seamen who should conceal themselves, will expire upon this Day: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the Bounties and Rewards thereby given, should be continued to be paid for some longer Time—The Lords Justices do therefore Order; and it is hereby Ordered, with the Advice of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy-Council, that the Bounty of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, of Forty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, and of Twenty Shillings for every Able-bodied Landman, be continued to be paid to such Seamen and Landmen respectively, who shall enter themselves in the Royal Navy on or before the Twenty-fourth Day of June next; and that the Reward of Forty Shillings to Persons discovering any Able Seaman or Seamen, who shall conceal themselves, so that such Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majesty's said Service, be likewise continued to be paid until the said Twenty-fourth Day of June next inclusive.—Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

Genoa, May 10. The Count de la Trinité, who was lately appointed Viceroy of Sardinia, arrived here on Sunday last from Turin, with a numerous Retinue, and on Tuesday he purposes to embark on board a Ship for Cagliari.

Venice, May 15. We are informed by the Master of a Ship from Smyrna, that they had several violent Shocks of an Earthquake in the Island of Metelin, one of the Islands in the Archipelago, towards the End of March last, by which a great Number of Houses were thrown down, and many Persons buried in the Ruins.

Copenhagen, May 16. The King has appointed M. Stocken, Lieutenant Colonel of Foot, to be Governor of Fladstrand, in the Room of the late Major General Schindels.

Stockholm, May 16. On Wednesday last, being the King's Birth Day, all the Foreign Ministers, the Senators, and the principal Nobility and Gentry, went to Drottningholm, to compliment his Majesty on that Occasion, and the Court was very numerous and extremely brilliant.

Rome, May 17. By the last Letters from Viterbo we received News, that on the 6th Instant they had felt there, and at Bagnara, three Shocks of an Earthquake. On the 11th In-

stant Bali Solari the Maltese Ambassador, agreeable to the Permission he had obtained of the Grand Master, set out for Piedmont his Native Country, where he proposes to pass the Summer. On the 14th Instant the Margrave and Margravine of Bareith arrived in this City from Florence, and lodge at the Apartment prepared for them by the Chevalier Coltrolini. Immediately on their Arrival, Cardinal Valenti sent one of his Gentlemen to compliment their Highnesses on his Part, and on the 15th they were presented by Cardinal Mellini, according to the Custom of this Country, with divers Sorts of Eatables, which were carried to their House by Twelve Servants.

Lisbon, May 17. A large Genoese Ship of Sixty Guns, lately bought by this Court, having been fitted out to fetch a Lading of Timber from Maranhon for the Use of his Portuguese Majesty's Yards, set Sail from hence on the 14th Instant, under Convoy of two Frigats, the N^o Sen^a de Attalaya of 40, and the N^o Sen^a de Arrabida of 36 Guns, who are ordered to see her safe as far as the Western Islands.

Vienna, May 18. On Wednesday last the Envoy Extraordinary from the Grand Signior had his first publick Audience of the Emperor, in the new Salon of the Palace in this City, His Excellency having acquitted himself of the Commission with which he was charged, proposes to set out shortly on his Return to Constantinople. Baron Gibson, Major General of the Imperial Forces, died here on the 10th Instant, in a very advanced Age.

Frankfort, May 21. The Landgrave of Hesse Darmstadt, who has been greatly indisposed for some Days past, is now perfectly recovered.

Turin, May 24. On the 11th Instant, very early in the Morning, a Body of between four and five Hundred Men, having marched in the Night-time from Pont Beauvoisin, entered Savoy at St. Genis d'Oste, and advanced to Rochfort, a small Village at some Miles Distance from thence, where the famous Mandrin had taken up his Quarters, and having immediately surrounded the House where he was, they seized him and one of his Companions in Bed. The said Body of Men were completely armed, but dressed like Peasants and Labourers. On Wednesday last arrived here from Venice, but last from Parma, M. l'Abbe Bernis, the French King's Ambassador to that Republick; he will set forward in a few Days for Paris.

Florence, May 24. On the 10th Count de la Tour, Son in Law to Count Richecourt, was, by Chevalier Pasquali, Grand Constable, invested with the Order of St. Stephen, lately conferred upon him by the Emperor. On the 21st, agreeable to the Articles settled and agreed upon between the Emperor and the See of Rome, the new Tribunal of the Inquisition was opened for the first Time; the Members thereof on the Part of the Pope are M. Biglia the Nuncio, his Auditor, and Fiscal Criminal, the Archbishop of Florence, the Inquisitor, and his Chancellor; and the Senator Antinori, Marquis
