Naples, May 27.

HE Marquels de Fogliani, Viceroy of Sicily, being on his Departure for that Kingdom, has been for fome Days paft taking Leave of the principal Perfons of this City. Yefterday the Margrave of Brandebourg-Bareith arrived here, and the Margravine his Spoule is daily expected; but as they travel incognito, they cannot receive the Honours due to their high Birth.' We have received an Account, that a Tripolitan Chebeck, on board of which were thirty Chriftian Slaves, whom the Mafter was neceffitated to employ in working the Ship during a violent Tempeft on their Return to Tripoly, had been carried by thole Slaves into the Port of Trapani in Sicily, where the Mafter and his Crew were put in Irons, and the Chriftians fet at Liberty.

tians fet at Liberty. Conftantinople, June 2. On the 17th paft we had a violent Fire near the Jews and Greeks Quarter, called Ballat, which began before Eight in the Evening, and continued burning until Six the next Morning. The Númber of Houfes destroyed is very confiderable, but mostly of poor Jews and Greeks. The next Day produc'd a fudden Change; our Vizir Aly Palcha Echim Oglu was depoled, after 51 Days Continuance in that Poft : As a Galley was not ready to carry him off immediately, he lay that Night in the Light House or Watch Tower we call Leander's Tower, and from thence wa. fent to Cyprus. The Selichtar Aga, or Swordbearer to the Grand Seignor, was also deposed at the fame Time, and is fince come out of the Seraglio with the Honour of three Tails, the Paschalyck of Heydin, and in the Post of Nif-Tangi, or he who is entrusted with the Grand Seignor's Signature. Nailly Abdulah Efendi the Jesterdar, received the Seals as Vizir : He was bred up in the Business of the Offices from his Tafancy. The latter End of \$747 he attained to the Post of Reis Efendi, in which he was fucceeded by the Present t- He is perfectly acquaint-ed with Business, and is a Man of great Pru-idence, and peaceable Disposition. Aly Pascha's Cheaia shared the Fate of his Master, and is kept in close Confinement until Accounts are the Univer-adjufted; and one Jegen Efendi, who had be-fore declined that Office, was obliged to accept. General Count During, Governor of this City, has been fo dangeroully ill for fome Days paft, that his Phyficians have very little Hopes of his Recovery. The King has difpoft of the Government of the Province of Weftmorland in Favour of Colonel Cronhiord.

Copenhagen, June 13. The Troops encamped in this Neighbourhood are regularly exercised as in Time of War. Last Wednesday the King dined with General Nummelen in his Tent; after which his Majesty went with the faid General to see the Form of Springing a Mine, and in the Evening returned to Frederichsberg. This Morning his Majesty went again to the Camp, and dined in the Tent of the Chamberlain Count Plessen, Colonel of the Horse Guards.

Hambourg, June 13. We are informed by Letters from Petersbourg, that the Eavoy Extraordinary from the Grand Seignor is on his Departure for Conffactinople, and that he is to be foon followed by Prince-Dolgoroucki, whom her Imperial Majefty has appointed to compliment the new Sultan.
