Constantinople, June 2.

THE Chevalier de Vergennes, who arrived here the 21st of last Month, to replace the late Count d'Alleurs in the Post of Minister from the Court of France, had on Saturday last his first Audience of the Grand Visier, and To-morrow he is to be conducted to that of the Grand Signior.

Parma, June 7. The Spouse to the Marquês de Fogliani arrived here last Wednesday, and the next Day waited upon the Duke and Dutchess our Sovereigns at Colorno. To-morrow she proposes to continue her Route for Placentia, where she intends staying till November next, and then to repair to Palermo, the Residence appointed for the Marquês her Husband in Quality of Viceroy of Sicily.

Modena, June 14. The Duke our Sovereign is arrived here from Reggio with all his Family, and intends to set out on the 25th for Rivalta, to spend the Remainder of the Summer. Count Montecuculli, Minister from this Court to that of their Imperial Majesties, who arrived here lately from Vienna, is preparing to return to that Court. A few Days ago a large Gang of Robbers were apprehended on the Road between this City and Massa, where they have committed very great Disorders. They are all committed to Prison, and will be tried in a short Time.

Cadix, June 17. On Thursday the 12th Instant arrived here from Vera Cruz, and lastly from Havanah, his Catholick Majesty's Ships the Castilla, the Europa, and Jupiter, and a Merchant Ship called the Dragon, under the Command of Don Gutierrez de Evia; these Ships bring eight Millions three hundred thousand hard Dollars in Specie, and about a Million and a Half in other Effects: And on Sunday the 15th instant arrived likewise two Sloops of War, and the St. Jago Advice-boat, from Cartagena, which had separated from the above Convoy fourteen Days after sailing from the Havanah. These three were met by the Achilles Man of War off Cape St. Vincent, which conveyed them safe into the Bay.

Stockholm, June 18. Their Majesties are gone to Eckolmsund, from whence they will return to Drottningholm the Beginning of next Week, where they intend to reside till the Opening of the next General Diet. Count Solms, the new Prussian Envoy Extraordinary to this Court, had a few Days ago his first Audiences of their Majesties at Drottningholm.

Naples, June 20. The King has ordered an annual Pension of 10,000 Ducats to be given to the Marquês de Fogliani, Viceroy of Sicily, in Consideration of his good Services whilst Prime Minister. The Maggrave of Brandebourg Bareith and his Spouse, having seen every Thing remarkable in this City, are set out for Ichia, in order to drink the Waters of that Place.

Madrid, June 23. On Friday last M. Marcolini arrived at Aranjuez with the Baret for Cardinal de Cordua, who had the Honour to be covered with it the next Day by his Catho-

lick Majesty, according to Custom; after which the King declared him Archbishop of Toledo. The Duc de Mazarin has passed through this City in his Way to Aranjuez, where he is going to pay a Visit to the French Ambassador, Duc de Duras, his Father-in-Law.
