*Whereas it has been humbly repreſented to the Lords
Juſtices, That on Tueſday the 5th of this Inſtant Au-
guſt, about Two o'Clock in the Morning, the Dwelling-
houſe of Robert Plummer in Caſtle-ſtreet, Reading, Berks,
was broke open; and among ſt other Things, the follow-
ing Goods were ſtolen, viz. one Piece of Blue Silk, con-
taining about ſeven Yards; two Pieces of Red Silk,
containing about ſixteen Yards; two Pieces of Brown
Silk, containing about ſixteen Yards; half a Piece of
Iriſh, containing about ſeventeen Yards; two Pieces of
