Petersbourg, July 18. The Feast of St. Peter and Paul, whose Names the Great Duke and the young Great Prince bear, was celebrated with great Maghificence on the 10th Inftant at the Caffle of Oranienbaum, where the Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction of both Sexes, repaired in rich Habits to compliment their Imperial Highneffes on that Occasion. The Envoy Extraordinary from the Grand Signior, who had his Audience of Leave of the Empress on the 25th past, made his last Vifit to the Great Chancellor Count Bestuchef on Friday last, and is fince preparing for his Re-turn to Constantin ple. The Prefents this Court intend to make him before his Departure, amount to the Value of 5000 Rubles. Prince Dolgorowcki, whom her Imperial Majesty has appointed to compliment the new Sultan upon his Advancement to the Ottoman Throne, in tends to fet out for Constantinople the Beginning of next Month, for which Purpose the several rich Prefents he is to carry with him for the Grand Signior, the Grand Vizier, and the principal Members of the Divan, are getting ready as fast as possible.

Gracow, July 28. On Wednelday last a Fire broke out in the Monastery of the Ladies On Wednesday laft a of Visitation, which spread fo fast, that it con-fumed, in a very short Time, five Churches, and about 70 Houses, with great Part of their Furniture. We have received an Account, that Count Charles de Brim-Opalinsky, Chief of one of the most illustrious Houses in Poland, died on Friday last at Gratz, in the Neighbour-hood of Posnania, and having left no Male Issue, the Title and Estate descend to the Count his Brother.

Lisbon, July 29. On the 24th Inftant the Fernambuco Fleet, confifting of 11 Merchant-men, arrived in this Harbour under Convoy of two Men of War, having been fixty-five Days in their Paffage; and at the fame Time arrived a Ship from Macao. The Treafure by the Men of War amounts to fomething more than 200000 Cruzados. The Effects by the Merchantmen confift in about 5000 Chefts of Sugar, 43000 Hides, and about 5000 Quintals of Brazil Wood, befides feveral other Articles of small Importance.
