A PROCLAMATION.

HARTINGTON.

'HEREAS the Lords Juffices of Great Britain have fignified unto us their Pleafure, that the Parliament

of this Kingdom, which now ftands Prorogued to Tuefday the Twenty Sixth Day of August Instant, be further Prorogued to Tuefday the Seventh Day of October next, then to meet and fit for the Dispatch of Business; We do therefore publish and declare, that the faid Parliament be, and accordingly the faid Parliament is, hereby further Prorogued to Tuesday the Seventh Day of October next, and that the fame shall be then held at Dublin, and fit for the Dispatch of Busines: Whereof the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Commons in this prefent Parliament, are to take Notice, and to give their Attendance accord-

ingly. Given at His Majefty's Caffle of Dublin, the 15th Day of August, 1755.

GOD Save the KING.

The Ramezan is Constantinople, July 17. finished with great Order and Tranquillity, and was fucceeded by the Bairam, at which Time it was ufual, in the late Reign, to exhibit Shows and Spectacles to the People; but this Prince doth not think proper to imitate it; probably to prevent the prodigeous Concourse of People which affemble on that Occasion. A very great and confiderable Fire happened on the first Night of Bairam, between the roth and 11th, near the Seraglio ; it burnt for thirteen Hours fucceffively, and did incredible Damage. The Grand Seignor, and all the Ministers, at-sended with great Assiduity. Many large Se-

raglios are burnt down. Yesterday several confiderable Changes were made in the fubordinate Posts of the Ministry; the Chiause Baschi; Janizar Efendifi, or Secretary to the Janizaries ; Jerfana Emini, firft Commiffary of the Arfenal ; Kadiliskeer of Romelia ; Spahilar Chealazy, or Lieutenant General of the Spahys, with feveral other inferior Officers, were all depoled : The lat-ter is fucceeded by Sadick Aga, the late Great Mafter of the Horle. The Selichtar Aga, or Sword Bearer, was a few Days ago difgraced. Jahia Pafcha is removed from the Beglerbeylick of Romelia, to the Paschalyck of Janina, and Achmet Pascha succeeds him. M. Ludolf, the Neapolitan Agent, has been named by his Court Envoy Extraordinary, to compliment the new Sultan ; and Prince Dolghorouky has Orders to prepare for this Court, with a like Character and Commiffion from the Empress of Ruffia.

Naples, July 22. On Sunday in the Even-ing their Majeflies went to the Great Market Place, to fee the Fireworks that are annually played off there in Honour of the Madona del Carmine, at the Expence of the Shopkeepers of the faid Market, when there was a great Concourse of People. A few Days ago the Duke of Bridgewater arrived here from Rome,

Naples, July 29. The King having thought proper to establish the Family of the two eldest Princes, has appointed the Prince of Santo-Nicandro to be their Governor ; the Marquis Ifastia, Sub-Governor to the Prince Royal; and M.
