**C**OUNT Sedelnicki, Great Treasurer of the Crown, who lately arrived here, has given Orders for repairing the Royal Palace. We hear from Cracow, that the Seat of Count Wielopolski, Master of the Horse, situate in the Neighbourhood of Czernowitz, is entirely reduced to Ashes, with all its rich Furniture, by a terrible Fire which broke out there a few Days ago.

*Stockholm, Aug. 12.* On Sunday last the Court went into Mourning for the Princess of Holstein Gottorp, Abbess of Quedlinbourg. The Senator Baron Scheffer, President of the Royal Academy of Sciences, resigned the same last Saturday, when the Members of that Society unanimously made Choice of Mr. Professor Klingenskierna, to be President in his Room. The almost continual Rains that have fallen in this Country for these five Weeks past, have greatly damaged the Corn, and other Fruits of the Earth.

*Bareith, Aug. 16.* The Margrave our Sovereign arrived here this Afternoon, with the Princess his Spouse, from their late Tour to Italy; and the Duke and Dutchess of Wirtemberg are expected here this Evening.

*Brussels, Aug. 20.* The Empress Queen of Hungary, our Sovereign, has appointed the Marquess de Bournonville to be Governor of Charleroy, in the Room of Count Nava, lately deceased.
