WHEREAS our Parliament stands prorogued to Tuesday the Twenty Third Day of this Instant September; we, with the Advice of our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, That the said Parliament shall be further prorogued, on the said Twenty Third Day of September, to Thursday the Thirteenth Day of November next; and we have given Order to our Chancellor of Great Britain, to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly. And we do hereby further declare our Royal Will and Pleasure, That the said Parliament shall, on the said Thirteenth Day of November next, be held, and sit for the Dispatch of divers weighty and important Affairs: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgeses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required to give their Attendance accordingly at Westminster on the said Thirteenth Day of November next.

Given at our Court at *Kensington*, the Twenty Second Day of *September*, 1755, in the Twenty Ninth Year of our Reign.

Whereas John Byrn, of Whitehaven in the County of Cumberland, Carrman, was, upon the Twenty Ninth Day of August last, charged by Information of two credible Persons upon Oath by them subscribed, before Peter How, Esq; one of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the said County of Cumberland, with having been guilty, upon the Third Day of June last, of being, with divers other Persons, to the Number of four and upwards, armed with Fire Arms, or other offensive Weapons, and so armed being assembled near a Place called Saltom, in the County of Cumberland, in order to be aiding and assisting in the Running, Landing, and carrying away uncustomed Goods—Which Information was afterwards certified by the said Peter How, under his Hand and Seal, to one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, who has laid the same before His Majesty in His Privy Council, pursuant to the late Act of Parliament of the Nineteenth Year of

the Reign of His present Majesty, in that Case made and provided—His Majesty doth, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, by this His Order in His Privy Council, require and command, that the said John Byrn do surrender himself, within the Space of Forty Days after the First Publication of this Order in the London Gazette, to the Lord Chief Justice, or one other of His Majesty's Justices of the Court of King's Bench, or to one of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace.

Kensington, September 21.

This Day Prince Golitzin, Envoy Extraordinary from the Empress of Russia, had his first private Audience of His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales.

And afterwards his first private Audience of the Princess Dowager of Wales at Carleton House. To both which he was introduced by Sir Clement Cottrell Dormer, Knt. Master of the Ceremonies.

Petersbourg, Aug. 23. The Empress, who has been for some Time past at Peterhof and Czarkazelo, came to her Palace in this City on the 13th Instant, which was immediately proclaimed to the People by a triple Discharge of the Cannon of the Fortress and the Admiralty. Their Imperial Highnesses the Great Duke and Great Dutchess came here likewise the same Day from Oranienbaum.

Warsaw, Aug. 25. We are informed by our last Letters from Lithuania, that the Distemper amongst the horned Cattle is broke out again in the Palatinate of Podlachia, and carries off great Numbers.

Stockholm, Aug. 26. The Court is still at Drottningholm, where Count Sintzendorff, who arrived here lately from Petersbourg, has been presented to their Majesties and the Royal Family. We hear from the different Provinces of this Kingdom, that the Elections of their Deputies to assist at the next General Diet, are carried on with great Unanimity; and, as the Time for holding the said Diet is drawing near, the Senators, who have been for some Time at their Country Seats, are daily returning to this City.

Berlin, Sept. 6. The King, who came here last Tuesday from Potzdam, dined that Day with the Queen Mother at Montbijou; and the next Morning his Majesty set out for Silesia, accompanied by the Prince of Prussia, Prince Maurice of Anhalt-Dessau, the Duke of Holstein, Major General Retzow, and several other General Officers.

Breslaw, Sept. 6. Last Thursday Morning the King of Prussia arrived at Glogaw, and having
