We allure your Majesty, that nothing could have been more distant from our Thoughts, and that as we always have been, so we ever shall continue to be, most ready and willing to support your Majesty's Prerogative, and all other the just Rights of the Crown, with the same Steadiness and Zeal that we shall endeavour to maintain the just Rights and Privileges of the People:

We beg Leave, in the most humble Manner, to express our Concern at our not having had an Opportunity, the last Session of Parliament, of laying our Proceedings before your Majesty in their proper Light, and of giving your Majesty the clearest and sullest Demonstration of our un-

bounded Zeal for your Service.

We have the truest and most grateful Sense of your Majesty's Goodness, and paternal Care, in taking the Circumstances of this Kingdom into your Royal Consideration; and acknowledge it as a particular Instance of your tender Concern for the Welfare of it, that your Majesty has been graciously pleased to appoint a chief Governor to prefide over us, of whose approved Fidelity and steady Attachment to your Majesty, and your. Royat House, we are fully persuaded s and of whose Honour, Integrity, Justice, and other eminent Qualities, we have conceived for high an Idea; that we promise ourselves; from his just and impartial Representation, your Majesty's true and faithful Commons will appear in such a Light, as to deserve your Majesty's Royal Favour and Countenance, which is most ardently wished for by us, and without which we should think ourselves unhappy, in the Midst of those Blessings which all your Majesty's Subjects enjoy under your most benign Influence.

We affore your Majesty that we shall steadfastly persevere in the same Sentiments of Duty, Loyalty, and Affection, with which we have Been always animated, and which we have always professed, for your Royal Person, and Illustrious Family; and that we shall, on all Occalions, exert ourselves, with the utmost Vigour, in Support and Defence of the Honour and Dignity of your Crown; and shall, as the best Evidence we can give of the Purity of our Intentions, and Sincerity of our Hearts, grant, with the greatest Chearfulness, such Supplies as shall be necessary for the Maintenance and Support of the Establishment, and for the Honour of your Majesty's Government; and concur in every Measure which may contribute to heal the Divisions which have, for some Time past, un-

Mappily subsisted amongst us.
