HE following Address of the Provost, Magistrates and Council of Glasgow, has been presented to His Majesty: Which Address His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

To the King's most Excellent Majesty,

Brassels, Nov. 11. We are positively affured, that the French have assembled upon the Esplanade at Douay, between fix and seven hundred Waggons. We are likewife informed, that Orders have been given by the Court of France for augmenting the Irish Brigade with 20 Men per Company. A Messenger arrived here Yeslerday from Vienna, with the Nev that the Empress Queen was safely delivered of an Archutchess on the 2d Instant. Bruffels, Nov. 14. All the Waggons that were lately affembled on the Esplanade at Douay, are gone empty from thence, and had been employed in transporting Carriages and Wheels for Cannon, which had been made at Peronne and St. Quentin. On the 1st Instant, 24 Pieces of Cannon were likewise brought from Arras, to the Arfenal at Douay, to be new cast. Our Advices add, that a great Number of Blackfmiths and Wheelwrights had been preffed to work in that Arfenal, where every Thing was preparing with the greatest Diligence.

The King has been pleafed to grant unto John Pownall, Efq; the Office or Place of Clerk of the Naval or Navy Office, in the Ifland of Jamaica in America, in the Room of Richard Shelley, Efq; deceafed.

Cologn, Nov. 9.
