HEREAS by His Majefty's Proclamation, bearing Date the Eleventh Day of November laft, " For recalling and prohibiting Seamen " from ferving Foreign Princes and States; for 46 giving Encouragement to Seamen and Able-" bodied Landmen, to enter themfelves on Board " His Majefty's Ships of War; for granting " Re vards for difcovering fuch Seamen as shall " conceal themfeives; and also for taking up all " Straggling Seamen ;" His Majefty was gracioufly pleafed to promife and declare, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and allo that the Bounty of Thirty Shillings for every Able bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, fhould be paid to every fuch Seaman and Land man respectively, who should, on or before the Thirty first Day of this Instant December, vo luntarily enter themfelves to ferve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by the faid Proclamation ; as likewife that the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fhould be paid to any Person who should, on or before the faid Thirty first Day of this Instant, difcover any Seaman, or Seamen, who should conceal themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman, or Seamen, fhould be taken for His Majesty's Service : And whereas the Time limited for paying the faid Bounties and Rewards is now near expiring ; and it being judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, that the fame should be continued for fome longer Time ; His Majefty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order,

and it is hereby accordingly ordered. That the Time limited by the faid Proclamation, for Payment of the faid Bounties and Rewards, be prolonged and extended from the faid Thirty First Day of this Inftant December, to the Thirty Firft Day of January next inclusive. And that the faid respective Bounties and Rewards be continued to be paid by the Perfons, and at the Times, directed by His Majefty's aforefaid Proclamation. W. Sharpe.

Madrid, Dec. 29. The 18th Inftant being her Catholick Majesty's Name-Day, was celebrated at Court, with the usual Ceremonies, but there was no Opera in the Evening, as this Diversion has been sufpended, fince the Earth-quake that was felt here and in Portugal the ift of November. His Catholick Majesty, in Honour of the Day, disposed of some Military Employments, and of fome Benefices in the Military Orders to feveral Officers of Diffinetion. Advice has been received by an Express from Cadiz, that on the 16th Instant had arri-ved in that Port the Register Ship the Purishima Conception from Vera Cruz, with near two Millions of Dollars in Specie, and other valuable Effects.

Master of the Ceremonies.
