WHereas the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council, of the 27th of January last, for paying the respective Bounties therein mentioned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and alfo to all Able-bodied Landmen, who should voluntarily enter themselves in His Majefty's Royal Navy; And likewife for paying the Rewards to Perfons discovering Seamen who should conceal themselves, will expire upon the 29th Day of this Instant February-And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, That the Bounties and Rewards thereby given should be continued to be paid for fome Time longer : — His Majefly doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, that the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and of Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, be continued to be paid to fuch Seamen and Landmen respectively, who shall, on or before the 31st Day of March next, enter themfelves in the Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by His Majesty's Proclamation of the 11th Day of November laft. And likewife that the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be continued to be paid to any Perfons who fhall, on or before the faid 31ft Day of March next, difcover any Sea-man or Seamen, who fhall conceal themfelves, fo as fuch Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majefty's Service. Conflantineple, February 3. The Vizir Cheaia was deposed on the 17th pass, but immediately named to the Paschalyck of Salonica, which gives him the Dignity of Three Tails. We are informed by Letters from the Romagna, that Earthquakes have been very frequent of late in that Country, and that feveral Houfes were lately thrown down by the Violence of a Shock at Sezza. 'Tis faid the Promotion of Cardinals, in Favour of the Nomination of the crowned Heads, will be made fome Time next Month.

Lisbon, Feb. 22. On the roth Inflant, his Britannick Majefty's Ships the Hampton Court and the Greyhound arrived here with feveral Merchantmen under their Convoy. There are now ten Ships with Provisions arrived from London, one from Dartmouth, and five from Ireland.

Ratisbon, Feb. 25. Laft Thursday we had, a most violent Storm of Wind in these Parts. It lasted about three Hours, during which it flid an infinite deal of Damage to many Houses in this City and its Neighbourhood, by firinging off the Tiles, and throwing down the City

bies. The Gardens have likewife fuffered greatly on this Occafion.

Hamburgh, March 2. Prince George of Holftein, Major General in the King of Pruffia's Service, having made fome Stay here, and at Eutin with his Brother the Bishop of Lubeck, fet out the Day before Yesterday on his Return to his Regiment, which is quartered at Riefenberg near Dantzick; the Prince takes Berlin in his Way, where he purpoles to pals a few Days.

Bruffels, March 9. A Batallion of the Re-giment of Rouergue fet out on the 23d of February from Thionville for Normandy, and was replaced on the 28th by a Batallion of Militia. A Batallion of Royal Artillery marched on the 26th of the fame Month from Metz, with feveral Waggons loaded with Field Artillery and Military Stores, and after joining another Train of the fame Sort which is coming from Strasbourg, is to continue its March towards Normandy : We learn alfo, that the Regiment d'Enghien took the fame Route on the 29th, and is to be followed by the Regiments of Champagne and Normandie about the 25th Infant ; We are moreover affured, that the Regiments of Clare and Berwick, which were in Garrison at St. Omer, received Orders on the 24th of last Month, to march directly towards Cherbourg, where they are to be embarked. The Duke of St. Albans, and feveral others of his Britannick Majefty's Subjects, are arrived here from France, in Confequence of the Orders iffued by the French Court, for them to quit Paris by the 1st Instant, and the Kingdom by the 15th.
